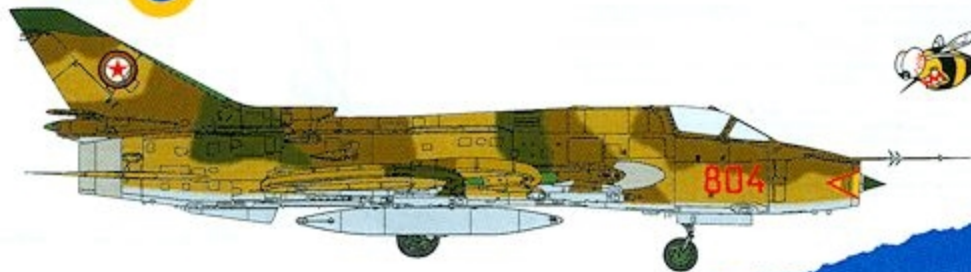

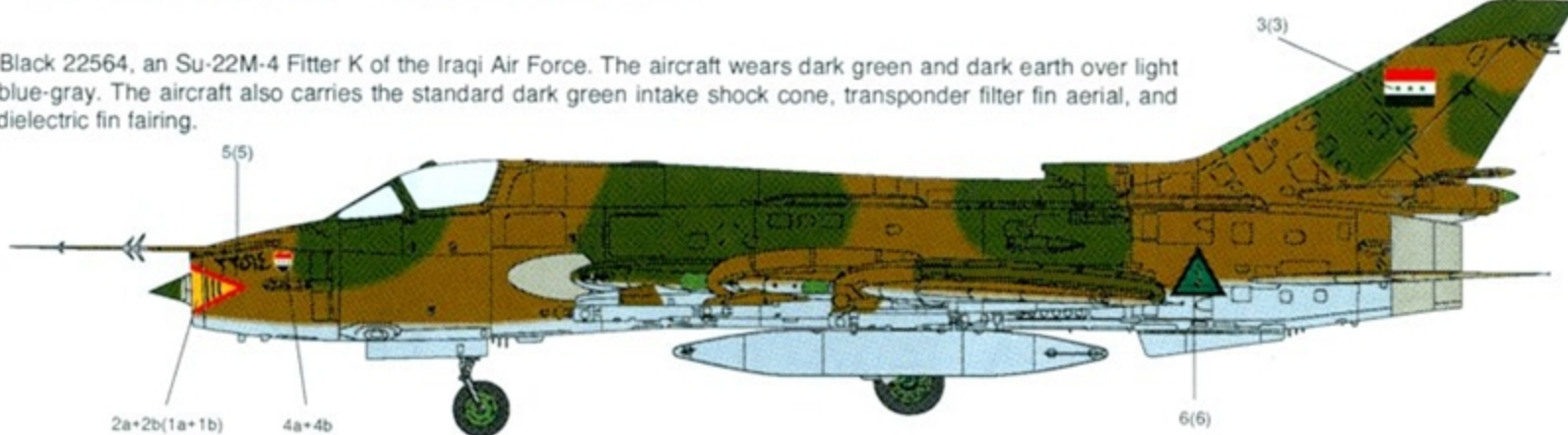

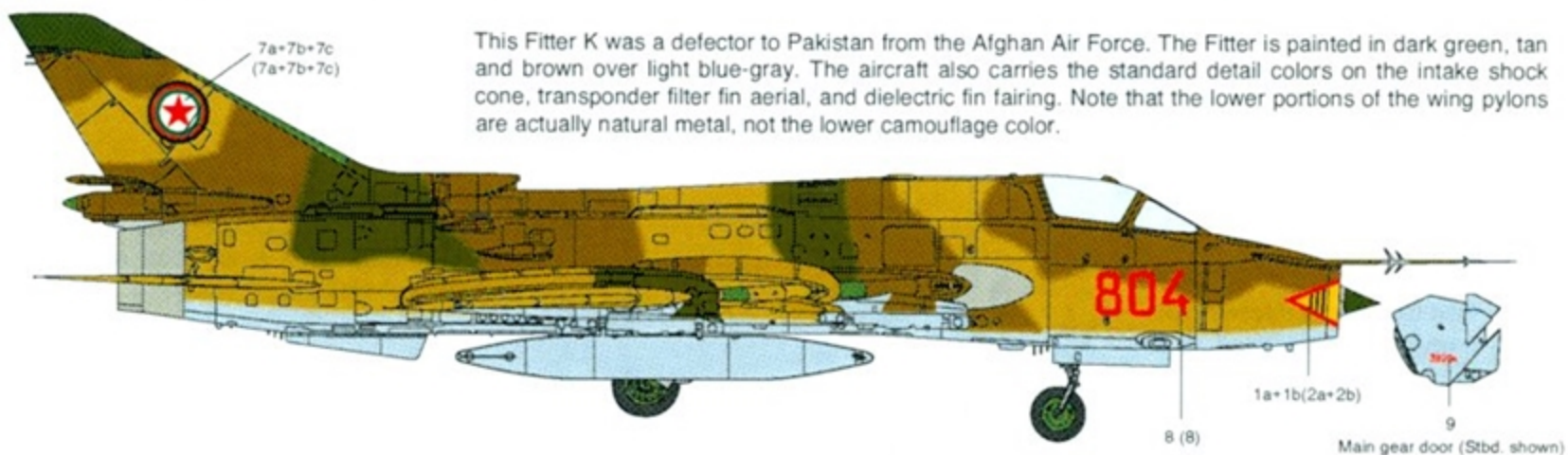

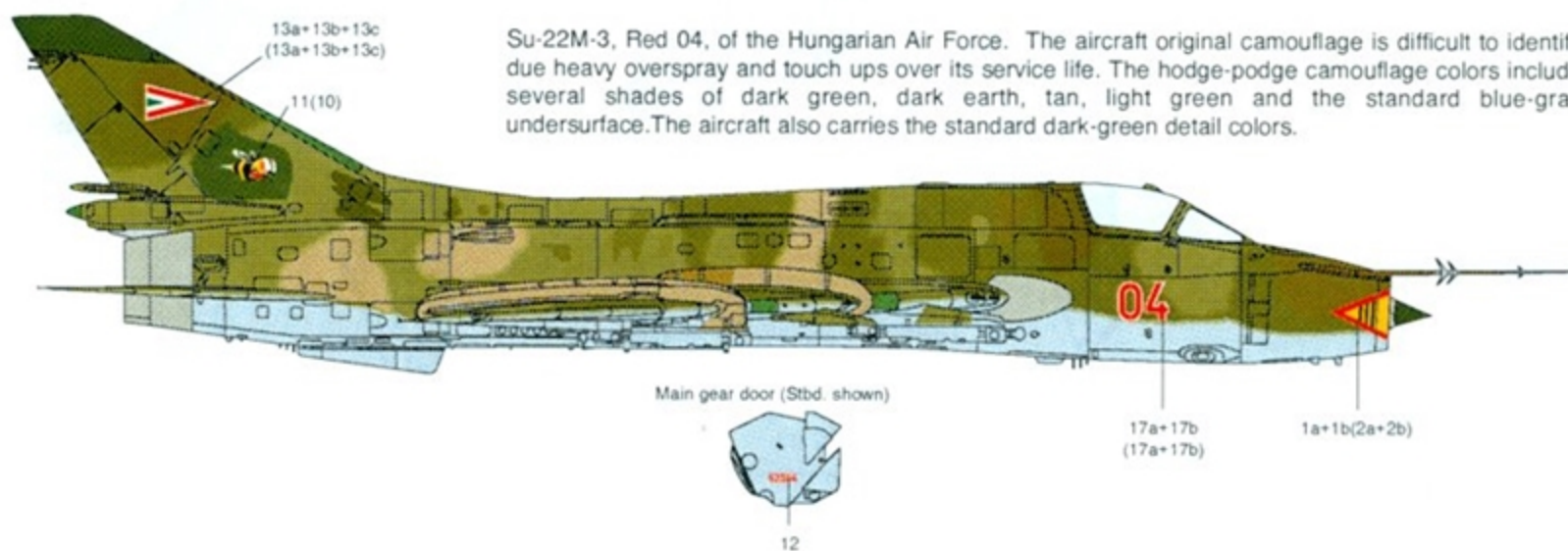
Black 22564, an Su-22M-4 Fitter K of the Iraqi Air Force. The aircraft wears dark green and dark earth over light blue-gray. The aircraft also carries the standard dark green intake shock cone, transponder filter fin aerial, and dielectric fin fairing.



This Fitter K was a defector to Pakistan from the Afghan Air Force. The Fitter is painted in dark green, tan and brown over light blue-gray. The aircraft also carries the standard detail colors on the intake shock cone, transponder filter fin aerial, and dielectric fin fairing. Note that the lower portions of the wing pylons are actually natural metal, not the lower camouflage color.



Su-22M-3, Red 04, of the Hungarian Air Force. The aircraft original camouflage is difficult to identify due heavy overspray and touch ups over its service life. The hodge-podge camouflage colors include several shades of dark green, dark earth, tan, light green and the standard blue-gray undersurface. The aircraft also carries the standard dark-green detail colors.



Yellow 34, a Su-22M-4 of the Ukraine Air Force. The Fitter is painted in dark green, light green, mid-brown and dark earth over light blue-gray. The aircraft also carries the standard detail colors on the intake shock cone, transponder filter fin aerial, and dielectric fin fairing.
