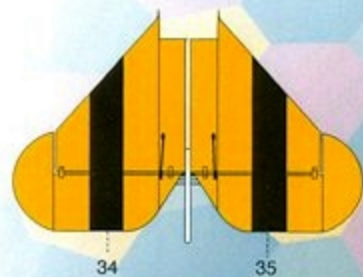
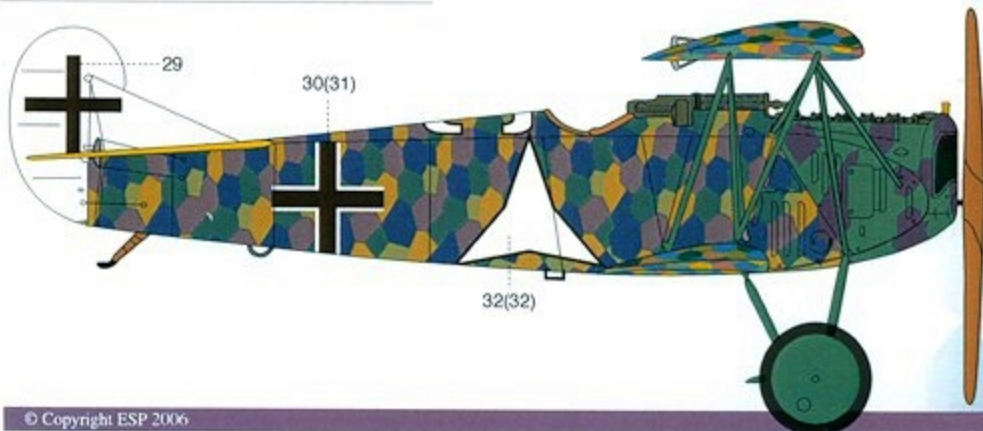
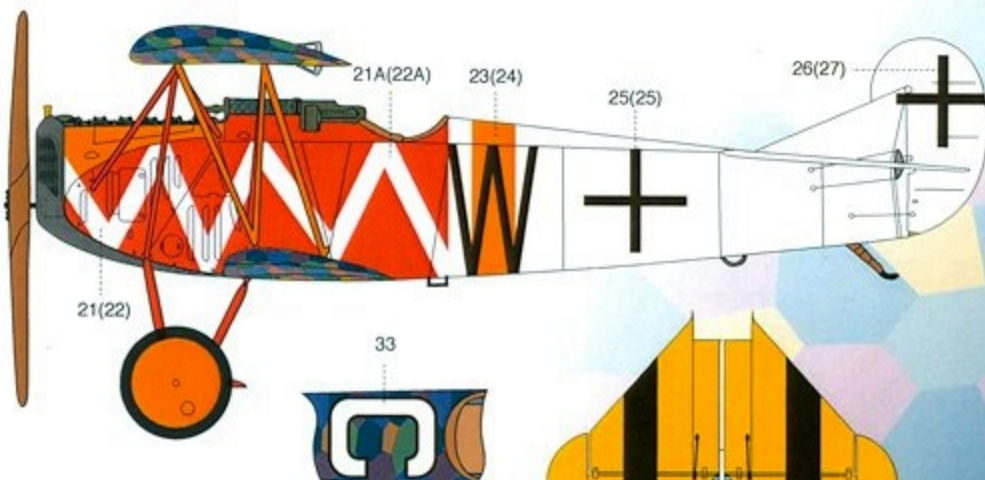
A/C Type	Fokker DVII (alb).
Pilot & Unit	Serial and pilot name unknown, Jasta 43.
Locale & Date	1918.
Camouflage & Markings	Very colorful a/c, covered with 4 color lozenge fabric. Upper wing painted Red with two White stripes, Dk. Green struts and wheel covers, Fuselage White or Lt. Silver Gray with Red stripes on the front section. White stab, elevators and rudder.



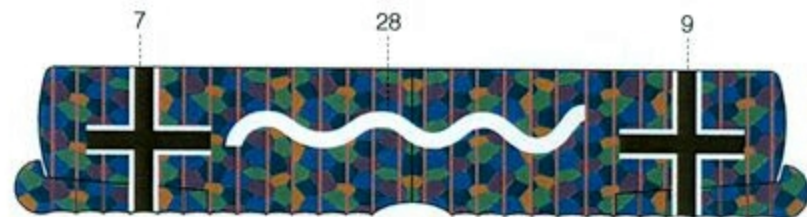
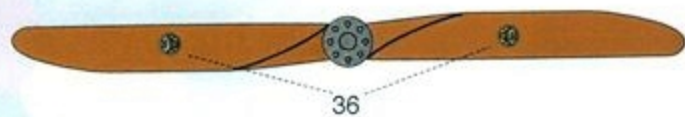
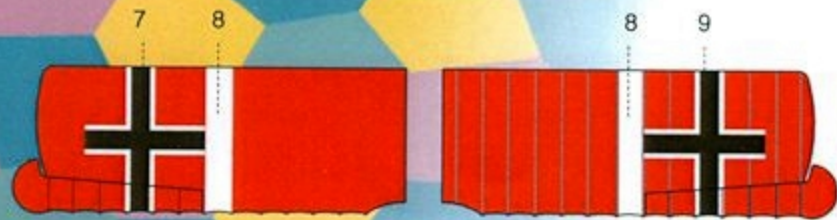
A/C Type	Fokker DVII (alb).
Pilot & Unit	Serial unknown, Lt.n.d. R. F. Jakobs, Jasta 43.
Locale & Date	Unknown, 1918.
Camouflage & Markings	Albatross factory Dk. Green nose panels, struts and wheel covers. Rest of the fuselage was painted Black with White markings all the way back to the empennage, which was White. Possibly covered with 4 color lozenge fabric.

A/C Type	Fokker DVII (alb).
Pilot & Unit	Pilot unknown, believed to be Jasta 46.
Date	Late 1918.

Camouflage & Markings Elusive and controversial scheme that we will leave to the experts. Forward fuselage in Red (others believe to be Black) with Black radiator and lower nose. Upper cowl seems a lighter color, possibly orange, as shown. White rear fuselage and empennage with Orange band and Black W. A zigzag shaped White stripe covers all the forward Red (or Black) fuselage. Wings are covered in 5 color lozenge fabric. Lower wing tapes appear to be cut from printed fabric. Notice the asymmetrical upper wing crosses.



A/C Type	Fokker DVII (oaw).
Pilot & Unit	Lt.n.d. R. A. Merz, Jasta 28w.
Locale & Date	1918.
Camouflage & Markings	Four color fabric with personal markings consisting of the "Mercedes Star" and White letter C on the deck behind the cockpit, both with Black borders. Standard oaw Green/Mauve on cowling, axel wing and wheel covers. Provisional Yellow/Black upper stab elevators markings. White vertical stab and rudder.
