




Part I

Fw-190D-9 of II.JG301, Straubing, Bavaria, Spring, 1945. RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolett over RLM 76 Lichtblau with very light fuselage, and moderate fin-and-rudder mottling. Black spinner with White spiral. Reference 5, page 4 shows the style of the #5 on Blue 15. Wr.Nr. unknown. A fictitious number has been provided in case you want to use it. Your choice.



Focke-Wulf Fw-190D-9 of II.JG6, Fürth, Germany, Spring, 1945, with unusual rank and tactical markings. RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolett over RLM 76 Lichtblau with a sparse mottling of RLM 83 Dunkelgrün on the fin and rudder. Black spinner. Fuselage extension was Natural Metal, heavily splattered with a Dark Gray, or perhaps there was a Reich Defense band, overpainted with a dark color. Ref. 6, back cover.



Focke-Wulf Fw-190D-9 of II.JG26 abandoned at Celle, Spring, 1945. This aircraft appears to wear an unusual scheme of RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 81 Brunviolett (not RLM 75) over RLM 76 Lichtblau. Black spinner with white spiral. Notice splashes on L.G. covers, possibly RLM 83. Ref. 5 page 2, Ref. 1 page 77, back cover.




Very Dirty appearance on these A/C specially around the exhaust/fuselage area.
