
Recommended kit: Airfix/Hasegawa/Paragon Design Lancaster Merlin 85 nacelles.






Lancaster B. Mk.I PD328. 'Aries'. Empire Air Navigation School RAF Shawbury 1945. This a/c made some long-range excursions to N-America, N-Africa and South Africa. The mid-upper turret was replaced by an astrodome. Note, 'Aries' on both sides nose. Recommended kit: Airfix/ Hasegawa.
