Spitfire Vc, s/n ES276. Flown by Lt. S. D. Feld, his A/C was camouflaged in Midstone, Dark Earth and Azure with a Red spinner. This A/C also had the large tropical filter. Spinner could have been Black or Red, the Red one being our choice. Nine kill marks show on the side of the A/C. Right side reads VD D.



Another spitfire Vc, s/n ES353, this one flown by capt. Jerome McCabe. Camouflage scheme as per aircraft one. The transcription inside the cross of Christ means "Win in this Sign". Right side reads VF C.



Spitfire Vc, s/n unknown, flown by Capt. John Blythe. Camouflaged as per a/c one, this one has six individual exhaust stacks on each side of the nose. A white spinner ring and several drawings/sq. badge decorate this machine. Full US markings identify this a/c. Right side reads VD F.



Mouth Detail



Chappie, a ferocious looking Spitfire Vc was flown by Lt. Richard L. Dixie Alexander of the 2/FS, 52FG. This a/c was marked and painted identically to a/c 3 with a few personal markings added. This last two a/c are as colorful as you will find on this theatre at this era. Right side reads QP A.
