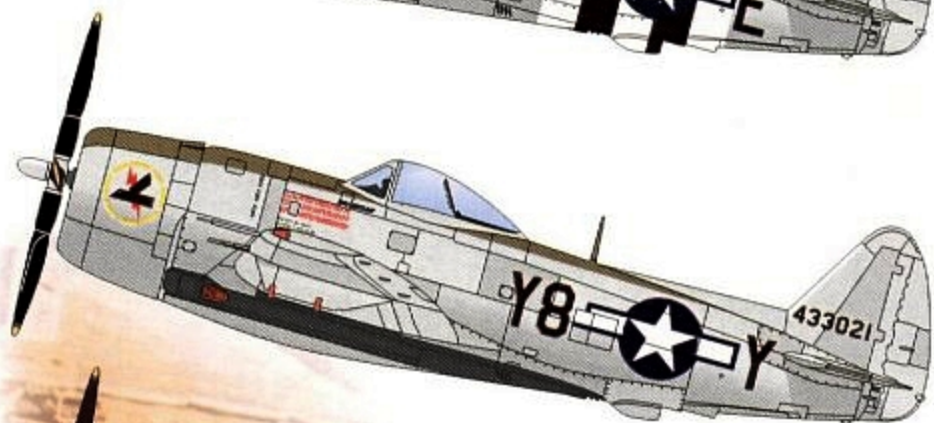

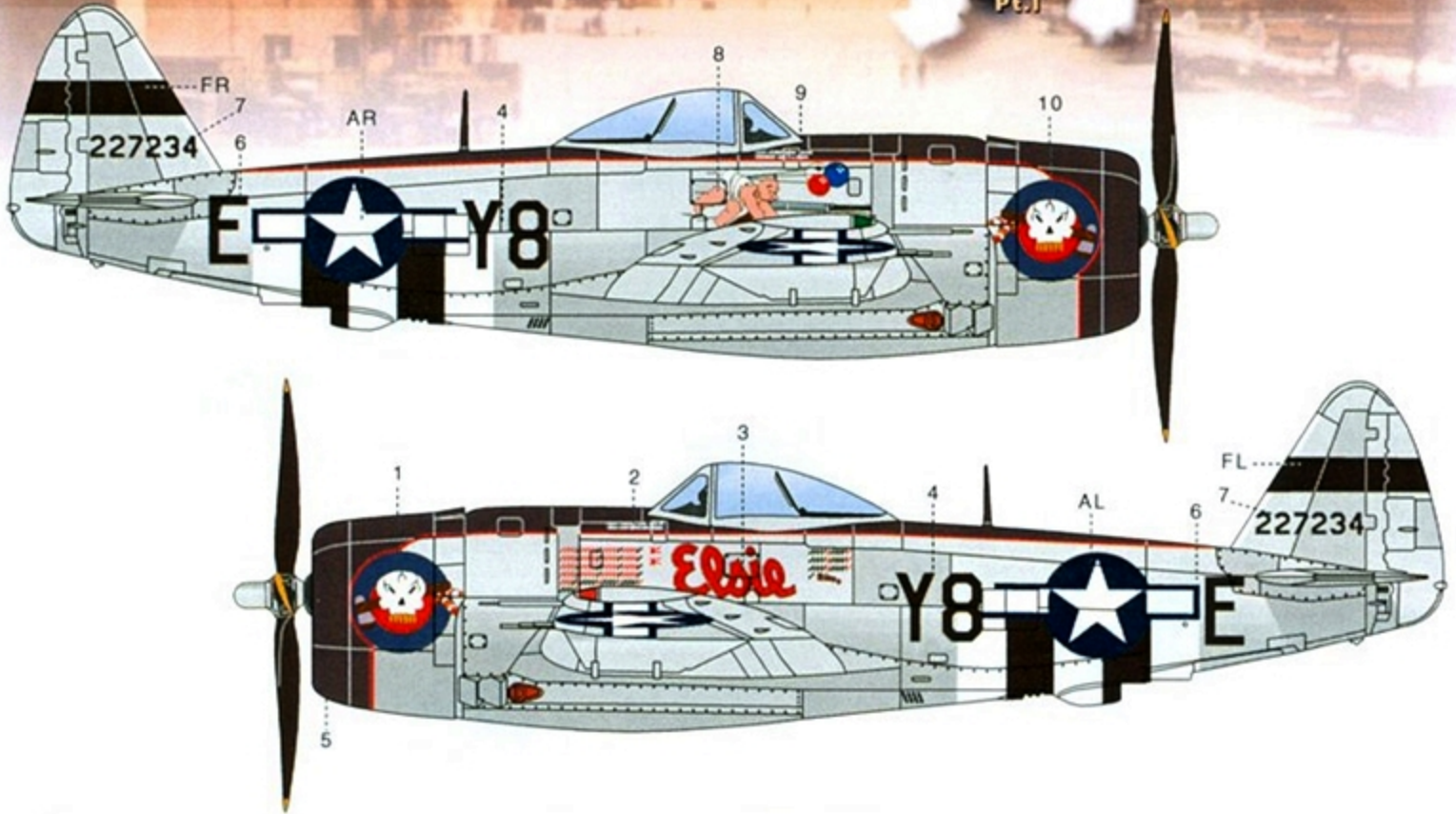

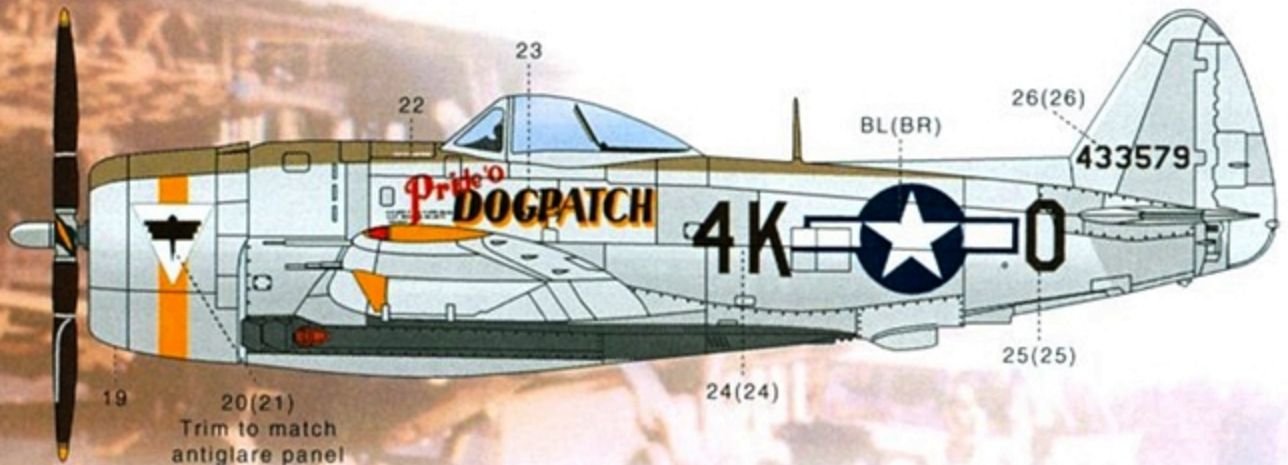
Thunderbolts of the "404" Pt. J



Aircraft 1 - P-47D-27-RE 'Elsie/Lil Butch', flown by Major Clay Tice, Squadron Commander of 507FS, 404FG. Overall natural metal finish with customized Black antiglare panel. Black tail bands. Partial invasion stripes on fuselage. Note oversized and doubled underwing insignias. Use Red decal stripes provided to border antiglare panel. H.S. propeller. No data block on this A/C.



Aircraft 2 - P-47D-30-RA, flown by Lt. William Lee, 507FS, 404FG. This aircraft wears the 1st version of the Thunderbird logo designed by Lt. Lee. It became the group's unofficial insignia near war's end. Aircraft was later named "Tin Hornet". Overall natural metal finish with OD antiglare panel. Note Black belly paint to hide exhaust stains. Red bomb racks sway braces.



Aircraft 4 - P-47D-30-RA, 'Pride O' Dogpatch' flown by Lt. Harry H. 'Pappy' Yokum, 506FS, 404FG. Overall natural metal finish with Olive Drab antiglare panel. Curtiss Electric 13'1" asymmetrical propeller with unpainted prop hub. Black belly paint. Yellow wing tips and forward pylons. Trim decals 20/21 to match painted antiglare panel.
