




Wing tip detail for "Boss's Hoss". Camouflage is Olive Drab upper surfaces with Neutral Gray lower. The Nationalist Chinese insignia is in the same location above and below the wings in four positions. Our reference book shows "Boss's Hoss" as clean but with some paint weathering. The aircraft was flown by Lt. Colonel Reed, CO of the 7th FS, 3rd FG Chinese-American

Composite Wing at Liangshan, China in August 1944. Reed finished the war with nine victories.

Actress Ann Sheridan signs her name on the nose of Boss's Hoss with Lt. Col. Reed looking on.





Ventura Decals are printed thinly. Cut out each item and dip in water for a few seconds, then leave to stand on a non absorbent surface. At first the decal will curl up and then flatten out. This indicates it has loosened. Apply carefully to a gloss painted surface and position with a minimum of moving about. We suggest "Micro Set" and "Micro Sol" to aid setting down these decals. WARNING. Test them on a decal from this sheet that is not needed for your subject.
