
The Early Days Pt. I




1. P-47D-5-RE 42-8659 Donnie Boy flown by Lt Don S. Gentile, 336th FS in February of 1944. Upper surfaces Olive Drab 41, lower surfaces Neutral Gray 43. White ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized blue-bordered national insignia under both wings. Two victory crosses on left side of cowl. Codes on the right side read T-VF. Individual code letter T repeated in black under the nose. The 108-gallon pressed paper drop tank under the fuselage was usually painted aluminum. Gentile flew Spitfires with No. 133 (Eagle) Squadron and became the Fourth's leading ace with 21.883 victories. Note the RAF style rear-view mirror.

P-47C-2-RE 41-6192 Lollapalocza as flown by Lt Woodrow Sooman, 336th FS, in November of 1943. Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43 with white ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized blue-bordered national insignia carried under both wings. Codes on the right side read D•VF. The individual code letter D repeated in black under the nose. The insides of the main wheel covers were decorated with a black and white checkerboard (see inset). Note the RAF style rear-view mirror. Lollapoluza's M.G. barrel goes all the way to the cowling tip.

3. P-47C-5-RE 41-6484 The Missouri Kid / Sho-Me flown by F/O Ralph K. Hofer, 334th FS in October, 1943. Upper surfaces Olive Drab 41, lower surfaces Neutral Gray 43. White ETO ID bands on cowl and all tail surfaces. Oversized red-bordered national insignia under both wings. One victory cross on left side of fuselage. Codes on the right side read L-QP. The individual code letter L was repeated in black under the nose. The 108-gallon drop tank under the fuselage was usually painted aluminum. "Kidd" Hofer bagged a Bf109 on his first mission with the 4th FG on 8 October 1943. He became the Group's second leading overall scorer and had 16.5 aerial victories. Note the RAF style rear-view mirror. Our references mention a yellow outline to the chin letter L, but we can not confirm it. Your choice!





Note on National Insignia:

The Monogram P-47 Razorback has molded-in wing pylons that may be troublesome when decaling underwing stars and bars. If the pylons are to be left on, simply cut off the decals on the marks and discard the inner section.

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Some of the aircraft in this series are P-47C or early D's, and require a little modification, mostly around the cowling flaps. For the P-47C, simply file off the two lower cowling flaps. P-47D is a different story. See Sqdn/Signal in Action # 1067 page 24. A very easy conversion.
