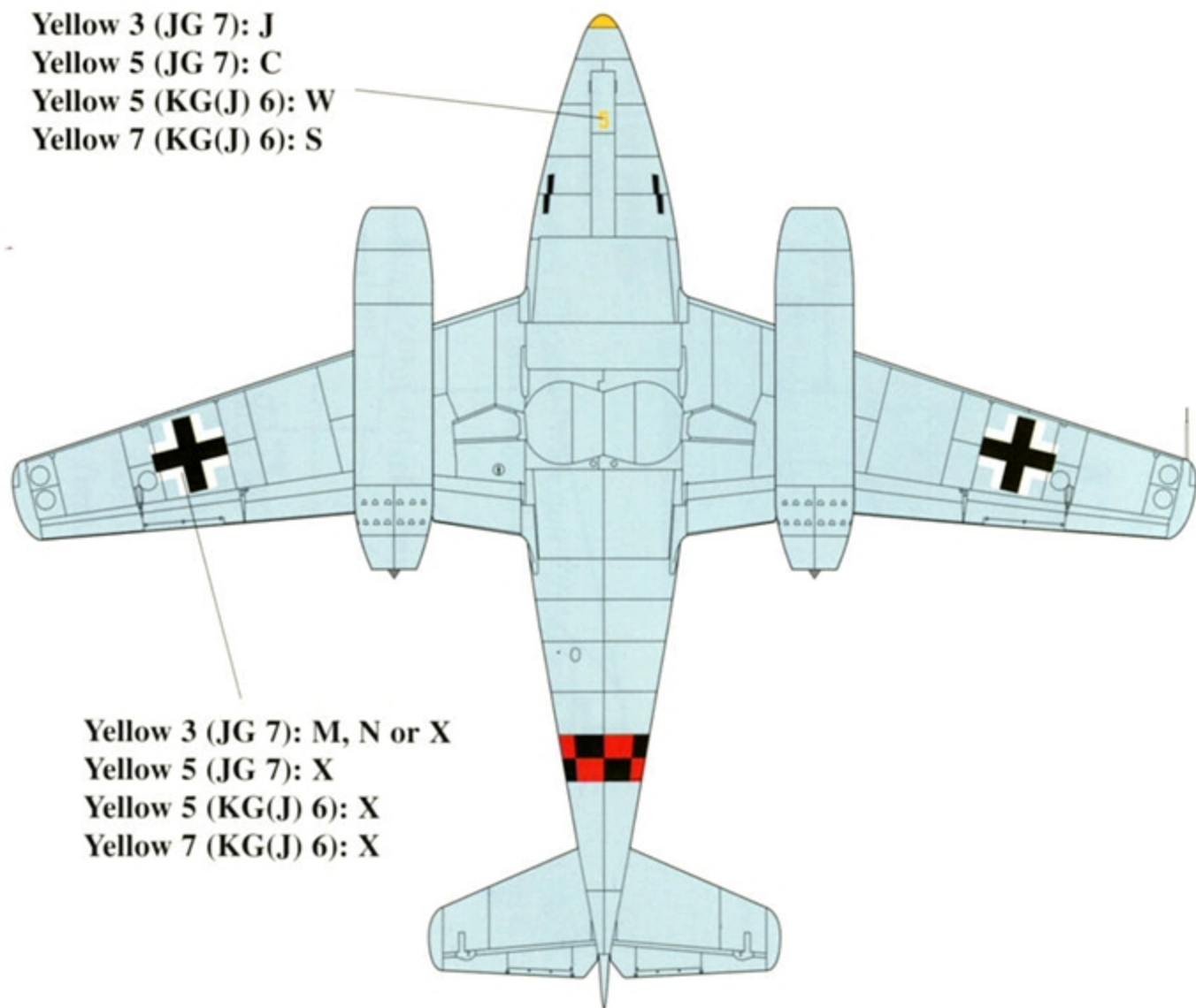


Factory uppersurface scheme

"Yellow 5" Me 262 A-1a W. Nr. 110007 Pilot: Unknown III/JG 7 8 May 1945 Celle-Hamburg, Germany

No headrest armor. Early type rudder and tail light.

Colors: Undersurfaces; 76 Light Blue; Uppersurfaces; 82 Bright Green, 81 Brown-Violet heavily mottled 82/81 Red/Blue Reich defense bands, the Red band is partially overpainted at rear. Black III Gruppe bar outlined in Yellow or White. Small Black 5 on nose gear door. Forward portion of port engine cowl natural metal. Adjoining cowl upper panel appears to be Light Gray primer or fresh 76 Light Blue. Overall aircraft paint is worn and weathered.

National Markings: Fuselage; 800 mm White outline crosses, 430 mm Hakenkreuz
Wings; Upper 630 mm White outline crosses, Lower 800 mm Black/White/Black crosses.

Stencilling: Factory standard.

Red/Black checkered RVband. Originally thought to be an *Industrie Schutz Schwarm (Factory Protection Flight)* with Green/Blue checkered RV band. New information indicates this machine was operated by KG(J) 6 utilizing their assigned colors of Red/Black checkered design. 04 Yellow nose cap.

National Markings: Fuselage; 800 mm White outline crosses, 430 mm Hakenkreuz
Wings: Upper - 630 mm White outline crosses, Lower - 800 mm Black/White/Black crosses.

Red/Black checkered RV band. Originally thought to be an *Industrie Schutz Schwarm (Factory Protection Flight)* with Green/Blue checkered RV band. New information indicates this machine was operated by KG(J) 6 utilizing their assigned colors of Red/Black checkered design. 04 Yellow nose cap.

National Markings: Fuselage; 800 mm White outline crosses, 430 mm Hakenkreuz
Wings: Upper - 630 mm White outline crosses, Lower - 800 mm Black/White/Black crosses.
