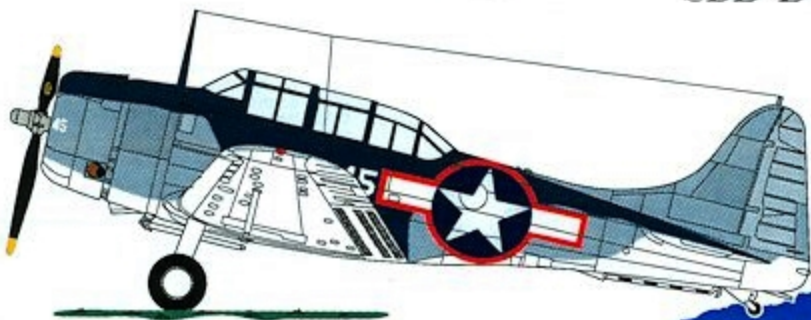

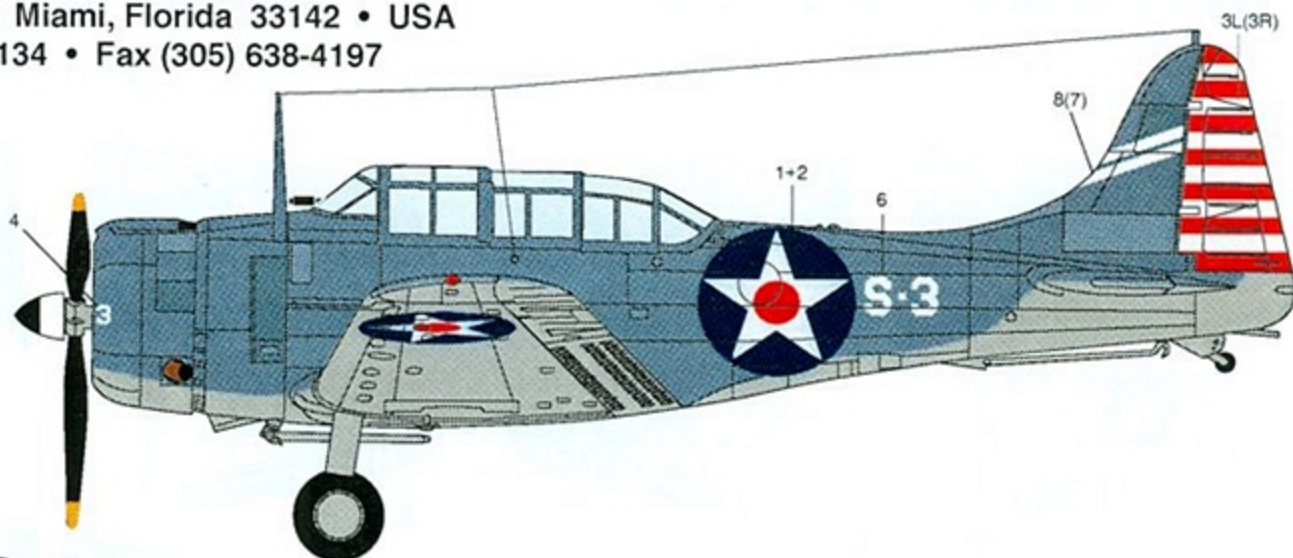

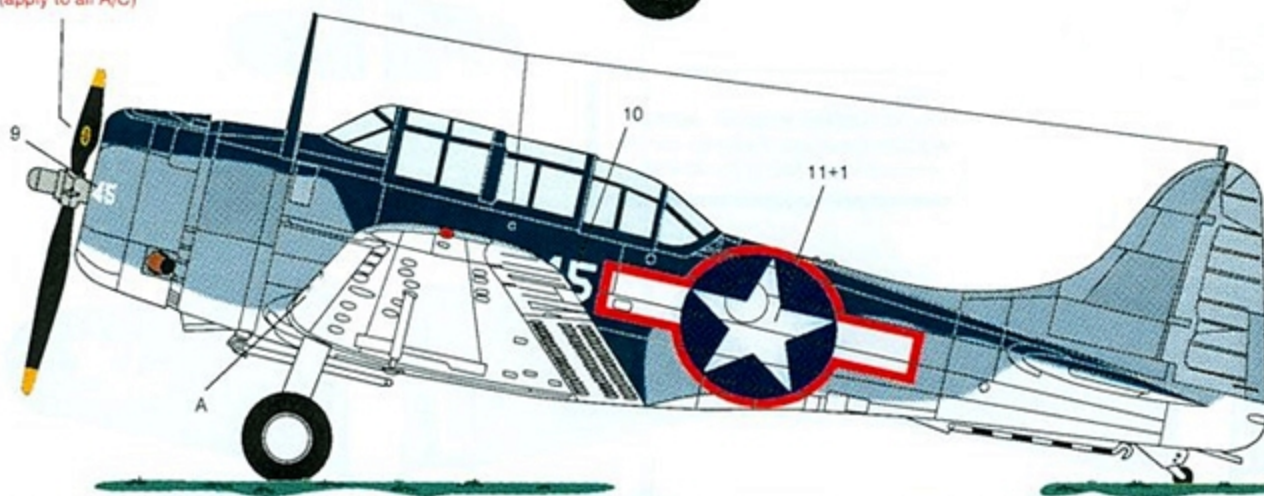

SBD-2 "S-3", Air Group Five, U.S.S. Yorktown at the Battle of the Coral Sea. Upper surfaces were non-specular blue-gray with non-specular light gray lower surfaces. The spinner was black & white.

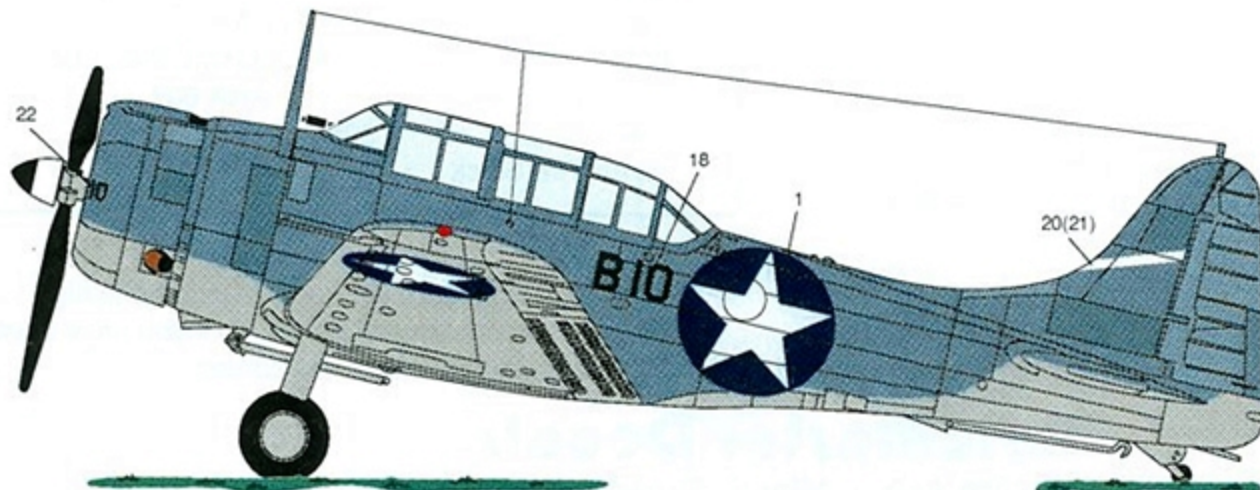
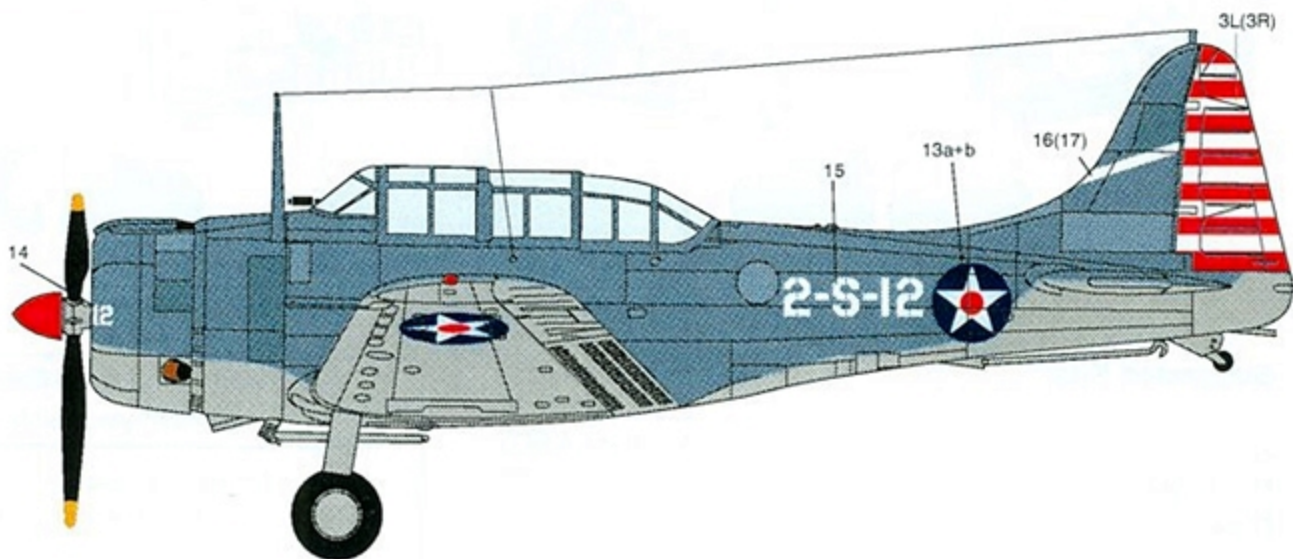

SBD-5 "White 45" of VB-16, U.S.S. Lexington, during the Gilbert Islands fighting 16 Nov. 1943. Tri color scheme consisting of semi-gloss sea blue upper surfaces, intermediate blue on the vertical surfaces and insignia white on the lower surfaces. Modelers should note that false gun ports were painted on the leading edges of both wings (decal item A).

SBD-3 "2-S-12" of VS-2, Battle of the Coral Sea, spring 1942. Upper surfaces were non-specular blue-gray with non-specular light gray lower surfaces. The spinner was red.



SBD-3 "B-10" of VB-3 flown by LT Syd Bottomly and gunner AMM2c Daniel F. Johnson, Midway, 4 June 1942. Pilot was credited with hitting a Japanese carrier and awarded the Navy Cross. Upper surfaces were non-specular blue-gray with non-specular light gray lower surfaces. The spinner was black & white.
