F7F-3N "LT-17" of VMF(N)-531. This aircraft was painted overall Glossy Sea Blue. The antennas on top of the fuselage were painted Orange. Photo on reference 2, page 35.

F7F-3N "WH-5" of VMF(N)-542. This aircraft was painted overall Glossy Sea Blue. VFM(N)-542 arrived in Japan on the USS CAPE ESPERANCE on September 11, 1950, and was then flown to Itami Air Base. Photo on reference 2, page 35.

Careful study of wing insignia placement on F7F reveals that position varied greatly. Most early A/C had the insignia closer to the leading edge, top and bottom wing. Later A/C seem to have the upper wing insignia moved back to about half of the airfoil cord. We recommend you look carefully at the mentioned photos.
