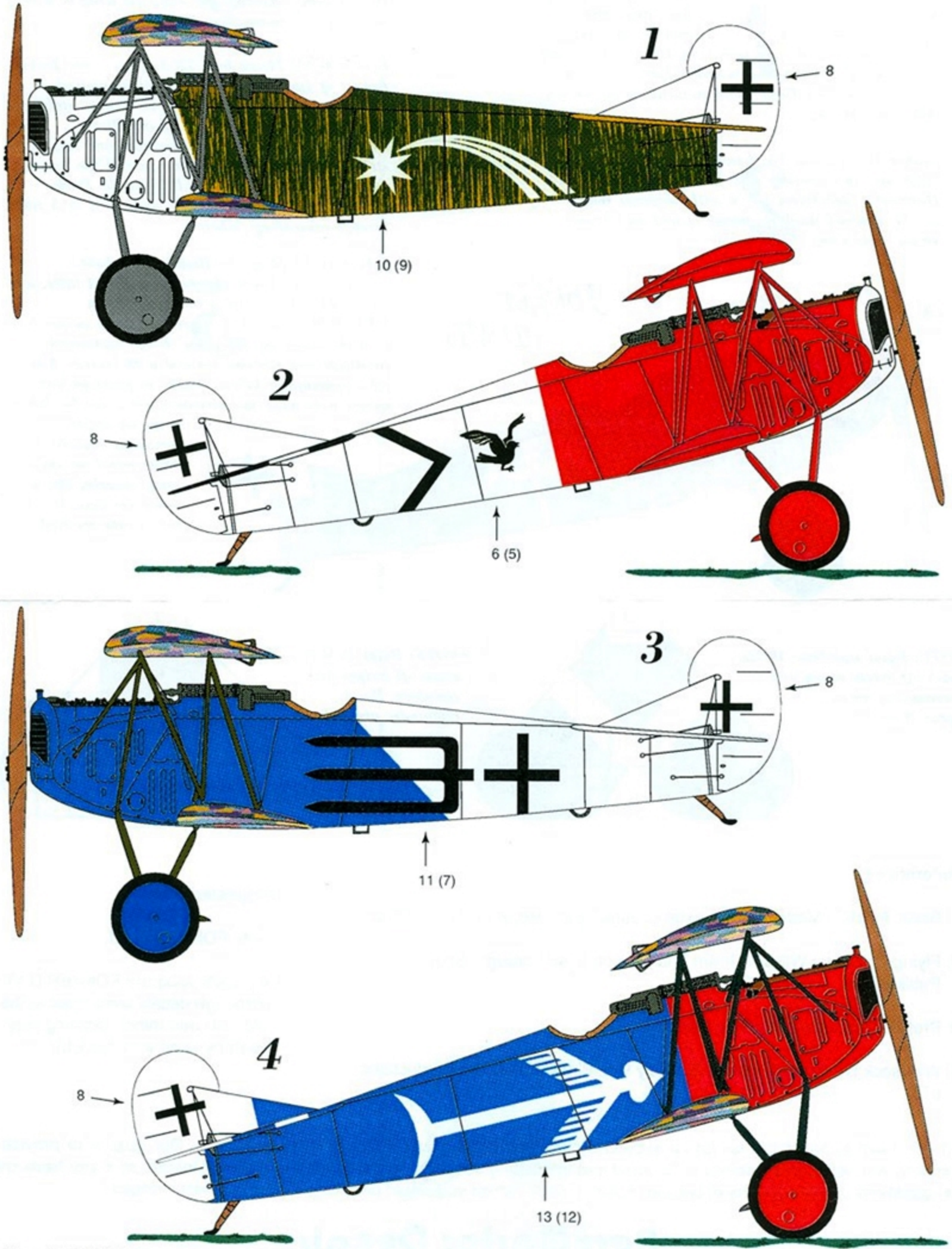

AeroMaster Decals™

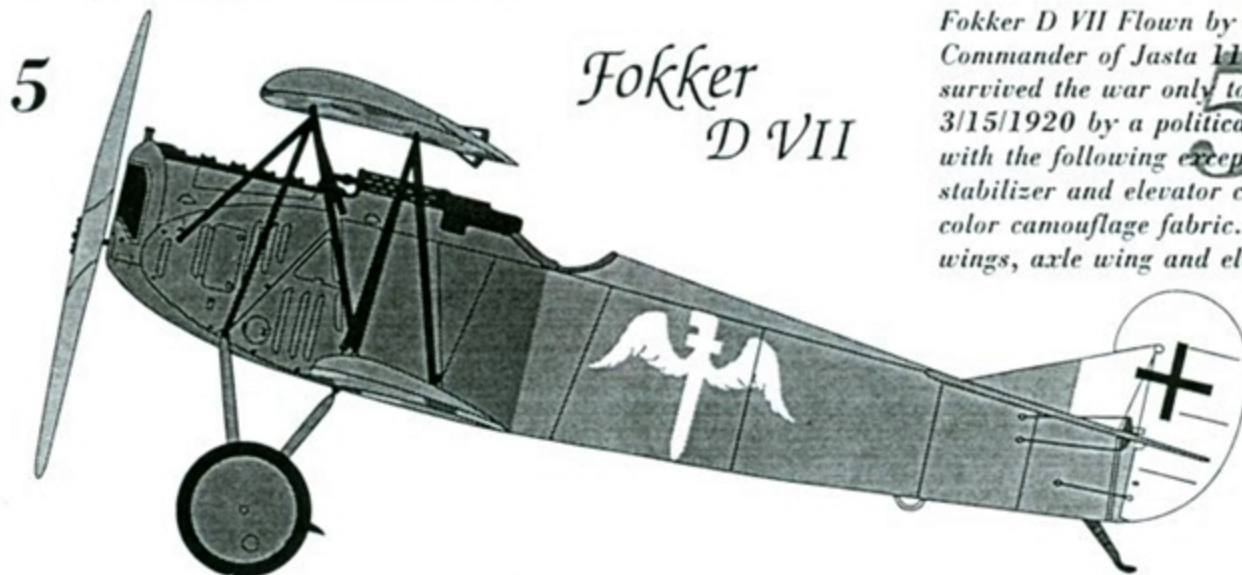
Fokker D VII serial unknown, Jasta 29. Flown by Oberleutnant Aufahrt. Upper and lower wings 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric (dark and light). Side and upper fuselage, horizontal stabilizer and axle wing, natural linen with streaks of Olive Green (exact shade unknown). Fin and rudder White. Struts and wheel covers Dark Gray. Nose natural metal (shown White for clarity).

Fokker D VII Jasta 18. Lower part of the nose, radiator, rear fuselage with fin and rudder White. Horizontal stabilizers Black with diagonal White bands. Forward fuselage, wings (upper and lower), struts, axle wing, wheel covers are Red.

Fokker D VII Flown by Rudolph Stark, Jasta Fuhrer of Jasta 35 at Epiaoy. Forward fuselage and wheel covers Blue. Rear fuselage, fin, rudder, horizontal stabilizers are White. Struts Black or Dark Green. Upper, lower and axle wing in 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric.

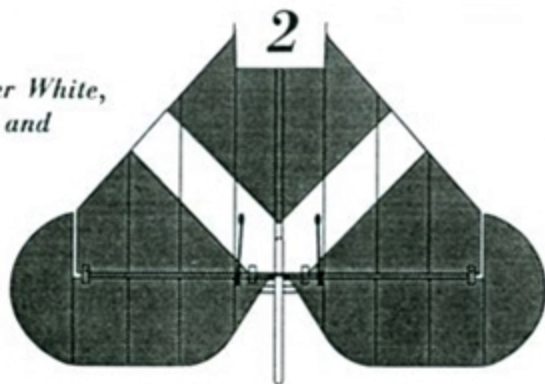
Fokker D VII Flown by LTN Veltjens when Jasta Fuhrer of Jasta 15. Forward fuselage and wheel covers are Red. Rear fuselage, horizontal stabilizer and forward part of vertical fin are Blue. Remainder of fin, rudder, elevators and lengthwise stripes on horizontal stabilizer, are White (upper and lower). All struts very likely to be Dark Green. Upper, lower and axle wing in 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric.

Fokker D VII Flown by Rudolph Berthold, Commander of Jasta 11, an ace with 44 kills, who survived the war only to be murdered on 3/15/1920 by a political group. Colors as per No.4 with the following exception: lower horizontal stabilizer and elevator covered with lozenge 4 or 5 color camouflage fabric. Upper surfaces of both wings, axle wing and elevators are Blue. No White stripe on upper horizontal stabilizer. White panel on upper wing, covering the 5 center sections. Landing gear struts are Red.

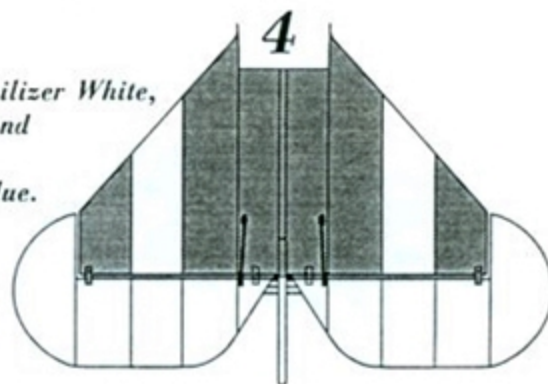

NOTE: Paint stabilizer White, mask off White stripe and surrounding areas. Spray Black.



NOTE: Paint stabilizer White, mask off stripes and elevators. Paint remainder area Blue.
