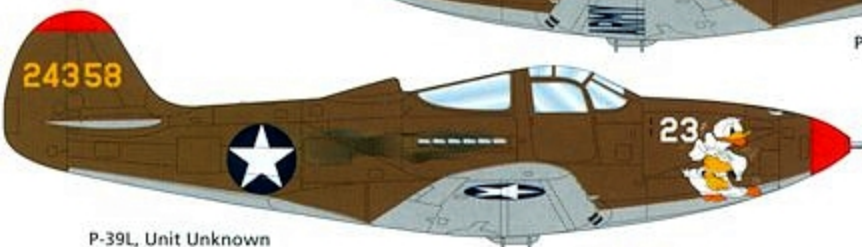

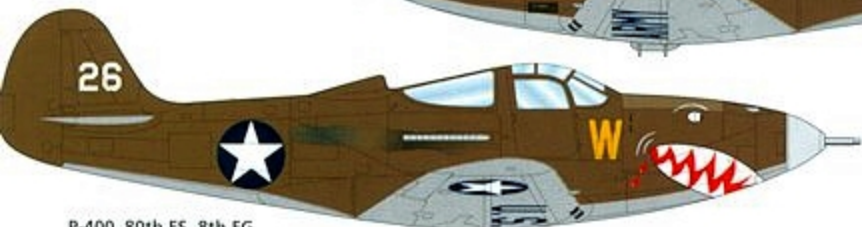

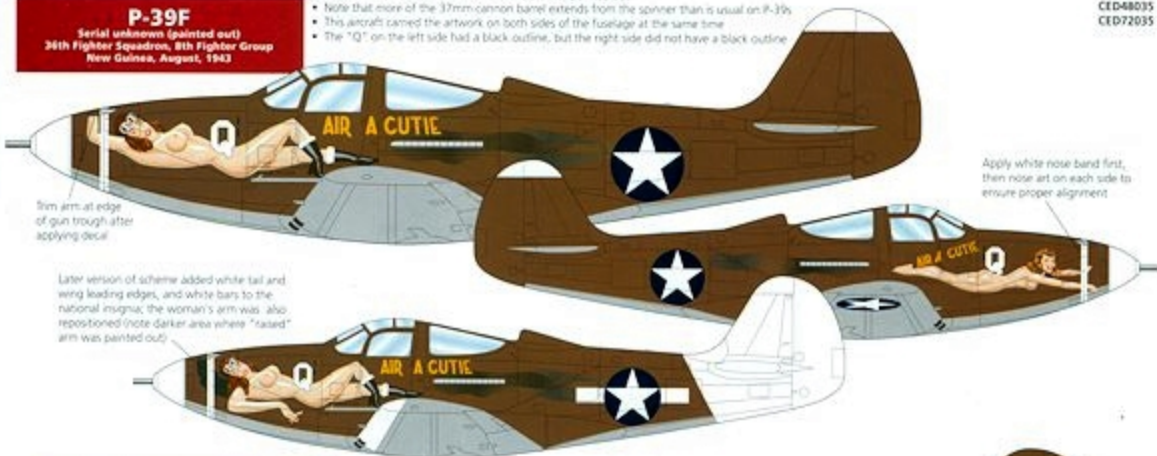

P-39F

Serial unknown (painted out)
36th Fighter Squadron, 8th Fighter Group
New Guinea, August, 1943

- The serial number on the tail of this aircraft was painted out
- Note that more of the 37mm cannon barrel extends from the spinner than is usual on P-39s
- This aircraft carried the artwork on both sides of the fuselage at the same time
- The "10" on the left side had a black outline, but the right side did not have a black outline



5mm arm at edge of gun trough after applying decal

Later version of scheme added white tail and wing leading edges, and white bars to the national insignia; the woman's arm was also repositioned (note darker area where "raised" arm was painted out)

Apply white nose band first, then nose art on each side to ensure proper alignment

- This was an early P-39D, which retained the 20mm nose cannon from the P-400
- Note the "U. S. ARMY" under wings
- Most unit veterans remember the skeleton's loin cloth as red, but some remember it as blue
- We don't know whether the artwork was carried on the left side of the nose (but have provided it in case further information is discovered)

P-39K-1

Lt William F. McDonough
40th Fighter Squadron, 35th Fighter Group
New Guinea, 6 February 1943



Add cow/vents from scrap plastic

Make short 37mm barrel from tubing

- Lt McDonough made two kills in this plane on 6 February 1943
- It doesn't seem likely the artwork was carried on the left side of the nose as well, but we've provided one just in case!

- This was an early P-39D which retained the 20mm nose cannon of the P-400
- Door artwork on left side only
- Note the "U. S. ARMY" under wings
