Mustang III, FB241,112 "Shark" Squadron, 239th Fighter Bomber Wing, Desert Air Force, Italy 1945. The uppersurface camouflage is US applied ANA colour equivalents to the RAF Day Fighter Scheme. The spinner was RAF dull red. Photo on page 32 in Action book.

P-51K Mustang Mk.IV KH653 QV-P. 19 Squadron RAF, early 1945. The camouflage on KH653 is the US version of standard RAF Day Fighter Scheme. This uses the ANA colours of Olive Drab & Sea Gray over Light Gray undersurfaces.

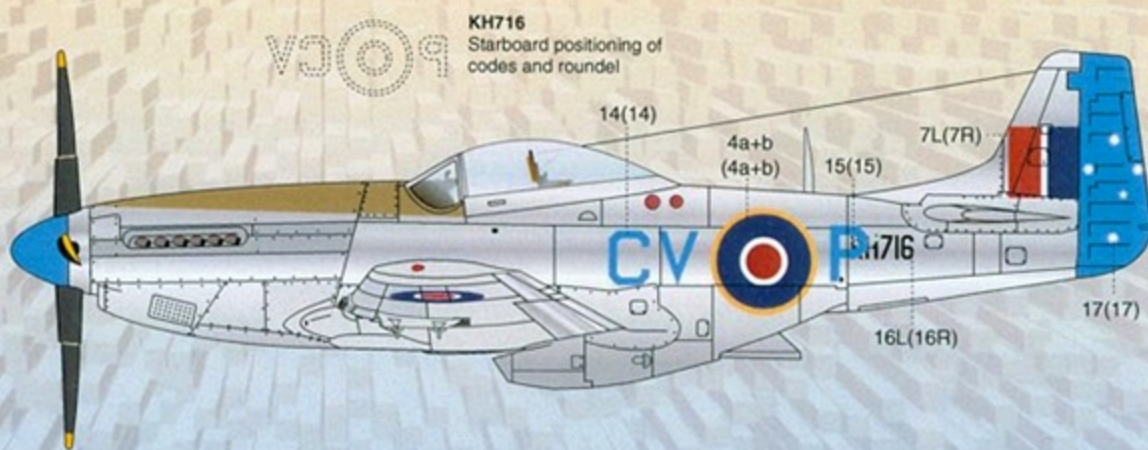

The Sky fuselage bands carried by CV-J and QV-P was 18" wide (9.5mm to scale)

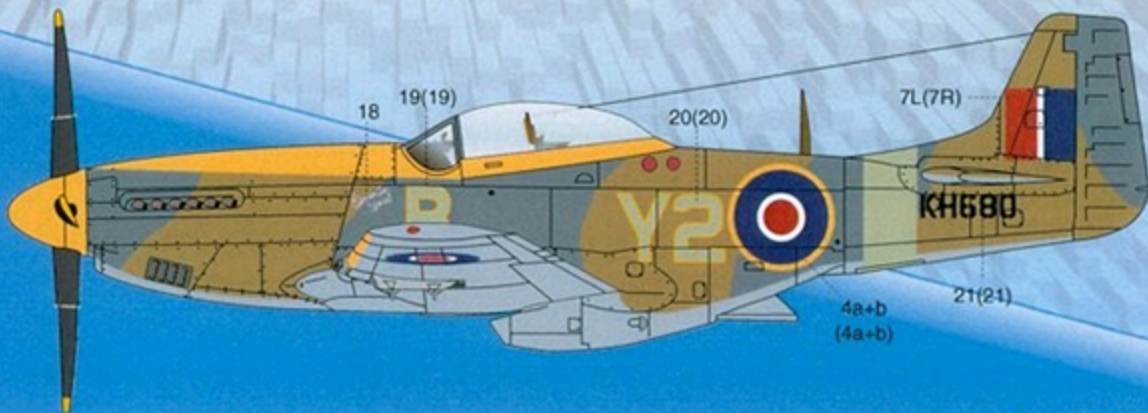

P-51D Mustang Mk.IV KH716 CV-P. 3 Squadron RAAF, Lavarino, Italy, 1945. The serial numbers on KH716 appear badly worn and this is assumed to have a similar appearance on the starboard side also. Note the use of Light Mediterranean Sea Blue for the codes and rudder.

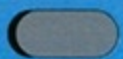

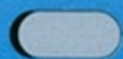
P-51K Mustang Mk.IV KH680 Y2-B 'Edmonton Special'. 442 Squadron RCAF, based at RAF Hunsdon, 1945. KH680's camouflage is US applied ANA colour equivalents to the RAF Day Fighter Scheme. It also carries a yellow spinner, anti-glare panel and canopyhood framing and 18" wide (9.5mm to scale) Sky fuselage band.
