


Suggested Kit: Tamiya, Hasegawa & Hobbycraft BF-109 B/C/E, Classic Airframes He 51.

Dr. Heinrich Neumann, physician to the Condor Legion, flew this Heinkel He51C of 3/J.88. The machine sports randomly applied patches of RLM 61 Dunkelbraun and RLM 62 Dunkelgrün over RLM 63 Hellgrau. RLM 65 Hellblau on all undersurfaces. Aluminum prop with RLM 62 spinner tip. Idiomatically translated, the fuselage inscription reads, "Don't do me, and I won't do you!" While photos do not confirm appearance of starboard-side script, a version (decal 27) is provided — just in case. (See inset for one possible configuration). Notice lighter patch behind number 2, possibly a touch up job. See page 156.



Staffelkapitän Harro Harder's Heinkel He51 of 1/J.88 wears patches of RLM 62 Dunkelgrün over RLM 63 Hellgrau. Harder applied the fuselage roundel's swastika devices contrary to regulations. Aluminum prop with RLM 63 spinner tip. See page 121.





Oblt. Erich Weitke's Messerschmitt Bf109B(?) of 1/J.88 wears patches of RLM 62 Dunkelgrün over RLM 63 Hellgrau — with RLM 65 Hellblau undersurfaces. Note four victory marks on the fin and black painted exhaust area. Aluminum prop with RLM 62 spinner. Upper surface camouflage pattern unknown. See page 152.



Oblt. Hans Schmoller-Haldy's Bf109E-1 of 3/J.88 wears RLM 63 Hellgrau over RLM 65 Hellblau undersurfaces. Aluminum prop with RLM 04 Gelb spinner. The beer mug represents the so-called "Order of Cardinal Paff." Note the black painted exhaust stripe along the fuselage. (Must be painted by modeller.) See page 179.



Hptm. Gotthardt Handrick, who won the 1936 Olympics decathlon, commanded Jagdgruppe 88 from July 1937 to September 1938. Handrick's Bf109C(?) in the markings of 2/J.88 wears RLM 63 Hellgrau over RLM 65 Hellblau. Note the Olympic logos painted on both spinner sides. Aluminum prop with white spinner tipped in the Spanish national colors (decal 20) and RLM63 trailing portion. See page 166/167.
