

# ReroMaster Decals.

1 Hero of the So Union (HSU) . Pavlo of the 6th Assault F ment flew Type in a Soviet tactic e of Earth Brown and Olive Gr lue Ullage. The inscription

ears port only. Note the softly sprayed White background to the fin eagle (must be painted). Although it is unlikely that the "eagle" appeared on the starboard side, we have also provided a handed version of this marking (decal 4).

2 Named after the famous test pilot Valerii Chkalov, who died in 1937, this single-seat Shturmovik sports another common tactical scheme of Black Green and Olive Green over Lt. blue. Note the red spinner. Photo on page 15 of shows reference 5 the camouflage pattern, but color is difficult to recognize. Our bet is as shown, but could also be Brown/Green.

3 Reportedly flown by future cosmonaut G. Beregovoi, this II-2/3 wears the standard tactical colors of Earth Brown and Olive Green over Lt. Blue. Note the white fuselage bands and fin/rudder markings. Note, too, the red prop spinner and forward fuselage.

## 4 Wearing tactical colors of Earth Brown and Olive Green over Lt. Blue, this II-2 typifies Soviet Shturmovik camouflage. Note the Dark Blue spinner and White fuselage band. The fin

## Color Notes about Sturmoviks


Although we have done extensive research on these A/C (all based on commercially available material), it has been almost impossible to recognize a standard camouflage pattern for them. We have provided you the best possible information we can gather about shades, patterns etc.

Accurate Miniatures has done tremendous research on colors and patterns behind the old Iron Curtain, and have come to somewhat different conclusions than ours (see kit instructions).

Taking into consideration the hap-hazardous manner in which their insignias, codes, numbers, slogans, etc. were applied, we believe that the camouflage patterns could be considered to follow the same practice.

We just want to make you aware of these differences, so that you can make your choices about which ones to use. Either way, you just can't go wrong with this beautiful model.
