NOTE: Notice these a/c have slatted wings. We have provided extra pieces on wing bands in case you opted to split the wings (K2 is for upper slat and K1 is for lower slat). Due to lack of decal space we are not providing you the stencils for these A/C. We suggest that you use the kit decal since the stenciling was very prominent on these airplanes.



This ferocious looking F-86E was flown by Lt. Julius Hegler and was stationed at K-13, Korea, during the summer of 1952. Jackies Jag flew with the 25 FIS. and wore a natural metal finish with Yellow ID bands, this time with a checkered fin/rudder.

NOTE: UNSURE OF RIGHT SIDE OF DROP TANK NUMBER SLANT (OPTION PROVIDED)

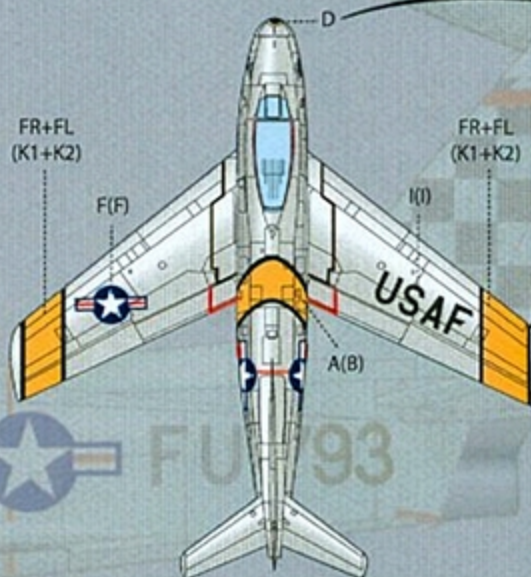


Shirleys Texas Tornado was an early F-86F flown by Lt. Sam Johnson. It flew out of K-13 in the summer of 1953 with the 16 FIS. Natural metal finish with Yellow ID bands and a checkered tail decorate this a/c. Notice the Tornado motif, the Red star, the number/stripe on the drop tank and the lack of wing fences.
