





Fw190A-8, W. Nr. 588717, Stab II Gruppe, 1945. RLM 83/75/76 camouflage. Yellow rudder and black propeller spinner with white spiral. Lower wheel cover parts of main gear covers are missing.



FW 190 A8/R8 of 11/IV/JG3. Flown by Unteroffizer Will Maximowitz, June 1944. A/C had the upper deck guns, as well as fuselage side armor. No D/F Loop on the bottom.
