




Texans in Algiers



 T-6D-NT 42-84836. Assigned to the École de Marrakech flight training school at Marrakech, Morocco, in late 1957. Overall Orange-Yellow (FS13538) finish with flat Black anti glare panel forward of the windscreen. French Air Force cocardes were carried in six positions on the wings and fuselage. This WWII trainer carried the Marrakech Training School emblem on a French Blue field on the cowling. The underlined number indicated it was armed.


2. T-6G-NF 52-8245. Assigned to E.A.L.A. 4/72 based at Aflou, Algeria, in 1958. Natural metal / aluminum finish with flat Black anti glare panel forward of the windscreen. Inboard wing panels were painted Yellow (FS13538) for visibility. Yellow-outlined French Air Force cocardes were carried in four positions on the wings only. The spinner and wing tips were painted glossy French cocarde Blue (FS15190). The unit emblem was carried under the cockpit on both sides. Note the gun pods and rockets under the wings and the small ADF antenna housing.






3. T-6G-NF 49-3004. Assigned to E.A.L.A. 10/72 based at Orléansville, Algeria, around 1958. Overall Yellow (FS13538) finish with Flat Black anti glare panel forward of the windscreen. French Air Force cocardes carried in six positions. The Yellow spinner had a Black spiral and wing tips were painted Black. The unit emblem was carried under the cockpit on both sides. Gun pods and rockets carried. Note the football style ADF antenna and aerial arrays. Most of the Texans serving in Algeria had their main landing gear door covers removed.

4. T-6G-NF 51-14440. Assigned to E.A.L.A. 13/72 based at Orléansville, Algeria, around 1957. Overall Yellow (FS13538) finish with Flat Black anti glare panel forward of the windscreen. French Air Force cocardes carried in six positions. The spinner was Red (FS11136). The unit emblem was carried on both sides of the fin. Gun pods and rockets carried. Note the aerial array and the absence of an ADF antenna. Photo page 66 reference 3.



5. T-6G-NF 52-8245. Assigned to E.A.L.A. 15/72 based at Paul Cazelles, Algeria, around 1957. Overall Yellow (FS13538) with Flat Black anti glare panel. French Air Force cocardes carried in six positions on the wings and fuselage. The spinner and wing tips were Red (FS11136). The unit emblem was carried in a Black panel on both sides of the engine cowling. Blue bullet, White rocket and red bomb mission markers were displayed under the cockpit on the left side in a Black panel. Gun pods and rockets carried. Note the aerial arrays and the football style ADF antenna.

6. T-6G-NF 49-3111. Assigned to E.A.L.A. 16/72 at Biskra, Algeria, in September, 1959. Natural metal /aluminum finish with short flat Black anti glare panel forward of the windscreen. Inboard wing panels were painted Yellow (FS13538) for visibility. Yellow-outlined French Air Force cocardes were carried in four positions on the wings only and the rudder stripes were replaced with a fin flash. The spinner and wing tips were Black with a White spinner spiral. The unit emblem was carried under the cockpit on both sides. Note the gun pods and rockets under the wings and the football ADF antenna housing.


