

ME-109G-14, Wr. Nr. 462892, 16/JG 53, January 1, 1945. This aircraft was flown by Gefreiter Alfred Michel on his first mission and shot down by anti-aircraft fire from the 90th Inf. Division, US Army at Halstroff, France. Pilot was taken prisoner. Scheme is RLM 81/83 on upper surfaces with spots of RLM 83. Undersides are RLM 76. Note that landing gear door covers are not installed.

ME-109G-14, 12/JG53, January 1, 1945. This aircraft was believed to have participated in the New Year's Day attack. Scheme is RLM 81/83 on upper surfaces with circular spots of RLM 83. Undersides are RLM 76. Underside of nose cowling is RLM 04 yellow. Note that landing gear door covers are not installed.




FW-190A-9, Wk. Nr. 980219, 2/JG 1, January 14, 1945. Flown by Pilot Officer Wilhelm Ade who was shot down in a dogfight with several Spitfires. Pilot survived with injuries. Note slightly rotated form of swastika and hand painted propellor markings shown on next page.


FW-190A-8/R8, Wk. Nr. 681497, 5/JG 4, January, 1945. Flown by Gefreiter Walter Wagner, this aircraft belly landed at St. Trond airfield and was made flyable by 404th Fighter Group, US Army. Scheme is RLM 74/75 over RLM 76. Cowling panel with emblem on left side is probably from another aircraft.
