

TBD-1 of VT-2. During the Battle of the Coral Sea on 7 May 1942, TBDs of VT-2 and VT-3, sank the Japanese Carrier Shoho. Camouflage in Dark Blue Gray uppers and non specular Light Gray bottoms. Propeller blades and hub were polished aluminum with flat Black back surfaces. Note non standard rudder markings (6 Red and 5 White stripes) and oversized fuselage wing roundels. Under surfaces of wing outer panels also in Dark Blue Gray.

TBD-1 of VT-7 Scapa Flow, April 1942. Camouflage as previous A/C. Standard rudder stripes with White and Black arrestor hook. Mother ship, USS Wasp (CV-7 was delivering Spitfires to Malta, while these A/C performed antisubmarine duties for the British. Wing Insignia on 4 positions. Camouflage as per A/C 1.

TBD-1 Flown by the only survivor of torpedo Squadron Eight (VT-8), Ens. George Gay during the battle of Midway, June 4, 1942. Camouflaged as per A/C #1.

TBD-1 of VT-6 sporting the early tactical camouflage of Non Spec Light Gray overall. Insignia on upper left and lower right wing only.










Monogram Devastator.
