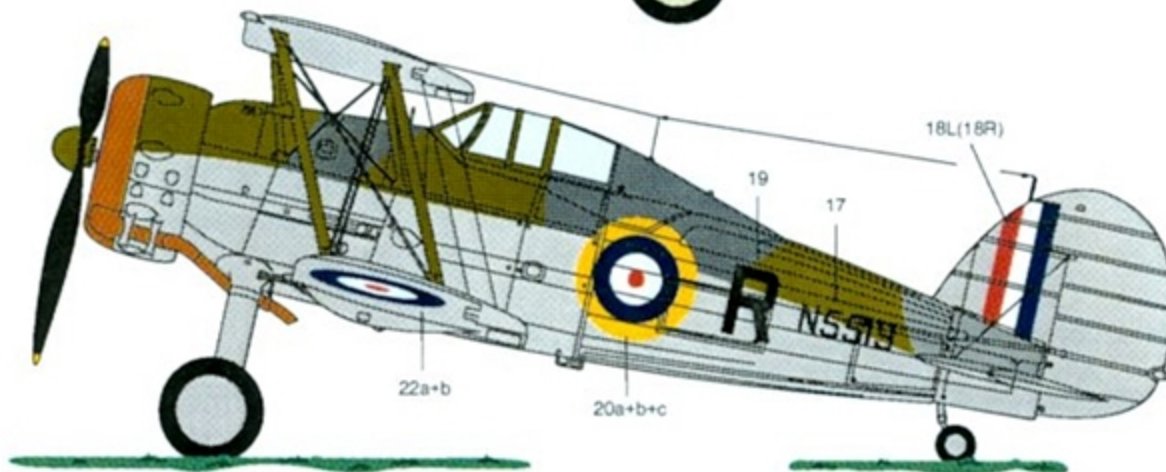
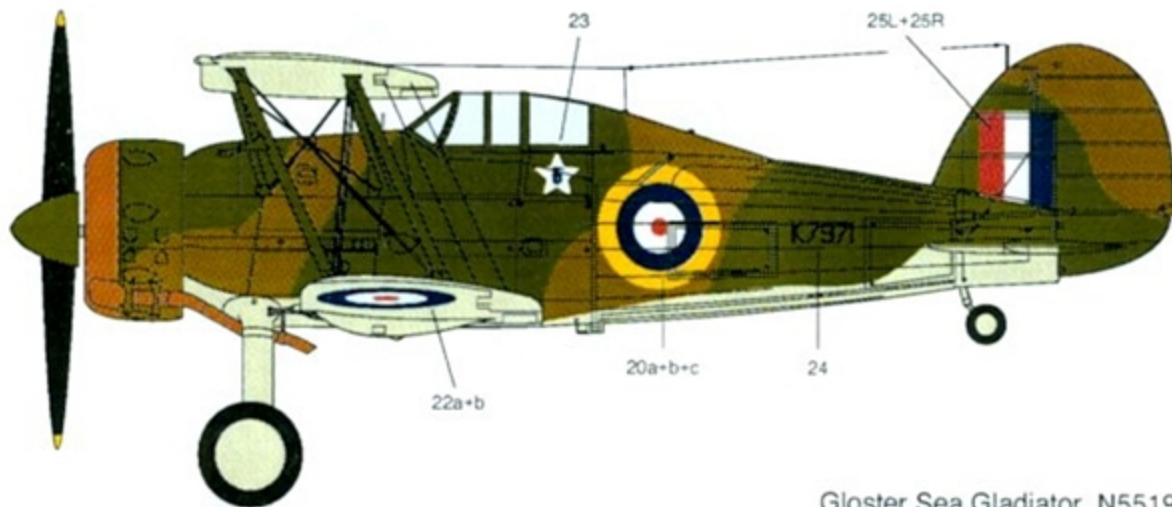

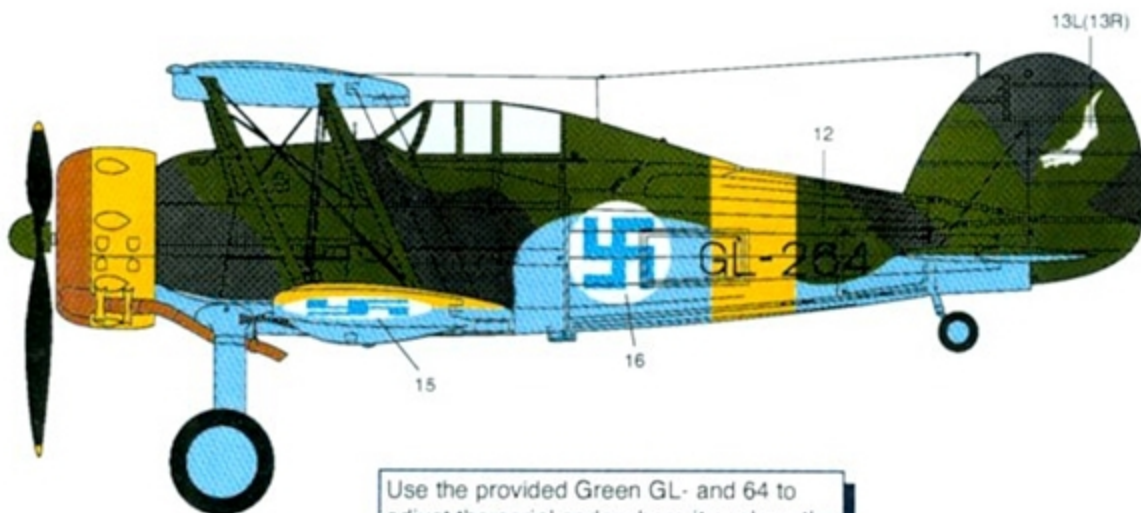

 Mediterranean Theater, 1940.
 This machine wears standard
 RAF Dark Green and Dark
 Earth over Sky.

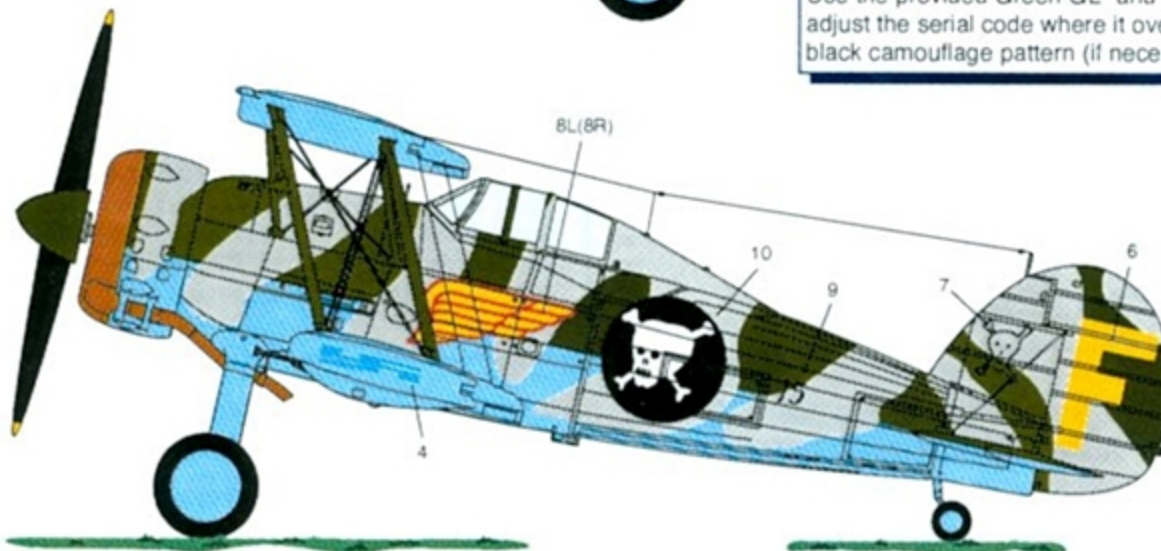


Gloster Sea Gladiator, N5519,
 Malta, 1940. Famous as one
 of the handful of interceptors
 facing Italy's onslaught during
 the dark days following
 France's collapse, this aircraft
 sports a very weathered finish
 of Royal Navy Dark Sea Gray
 and Dark Slate Gray over
 Medium Sea Gray. Note the
 non-standard fin flash and
 three-bladed propeller.

Finnish Air Force Gladiator
 Mk.II of LeLv 16, 1942.
 Camouflage consists of dark
 green and black over sky blue
 in the standard "Continuation
 War" pattern. Yellow cowling
 (aft of the collector ring), lower
 wing tips and rear fuselage
 stripe are standard Finnish
 Eastern Front identification
 devices. Note the three-bladed
 propeller.



Use the provided Green GL- and 64 to
 adjust the serial code where it overlaps the
 black camouflage pattern (if necessary).

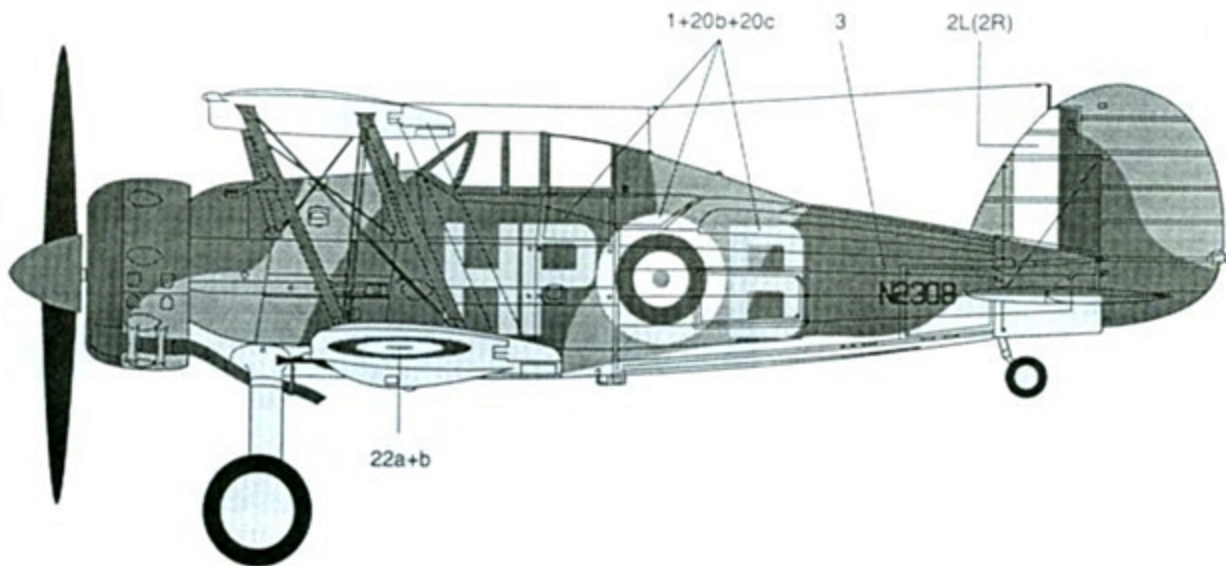


Swedish volunteer J8
 Gladiator, on loan to the
 Finnish Air Force during
 the Winter War, March,
 1940. Aluminum lacquer
 randomly sprayed atop the
 standard Swedish scheme
 of dark green and sky
 blue.

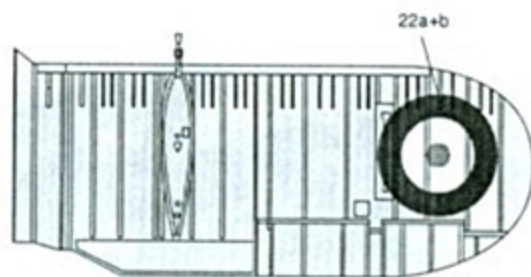

Lindberg's Gloster Gladiator

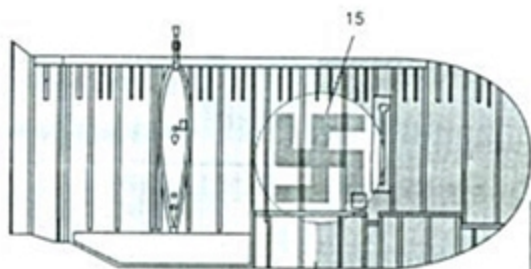
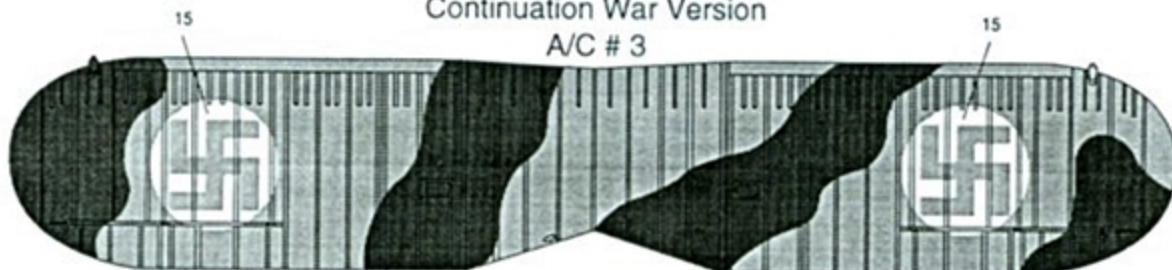
Mk. 1, N2308, of No. 247 Sqn., the only operational Gladiator-equipped unit on British soil during the Battle of Britain, 1940. This machine wears standard RAF Dark Green and Dark Earth over Sky. Published references disagree as to the actual size of the fuselage codes, though most seem to support the size provided.



Camouflage and Markings Placement for A/C #1, #2, & #5

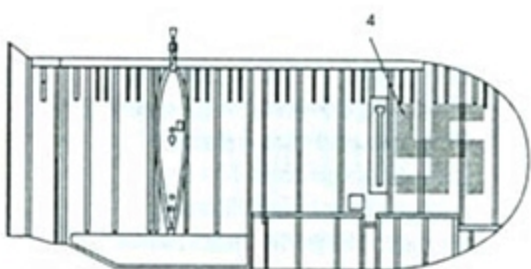


Continuation War Version A/C # 3
