




A-26C Invader, 43-22555, 86th Bomb Squadron, 47th Bomb Group, 12th Air Force, Italy, 1945. Overall Flat Black with Red propeller warning stripe. Prop stripe does not extend across nose gear doors. Note lower gun turret and early style canopy (this aircraft only). This is a WW II A/C. A-26B Invader, 43-34532. Korea 1950. A/C of the 730 BS wears an overall O.D. paint job with spinner and all flying surfaces tips Yellow, as well as all other markings. Vertical fin is natural metal, possibly a battle damage replacement. Question mark and bombs are White. Three bomb rows. Some sources believe the A/C to be very faded Flat Black. S/S #1037, page 33 shows a good photo. You decide! A-26B Invader, 44-34571, KTTV Channel 11, 729th Bomb Squadron, 452nd Bomb Group, 1951. Overall Natural Metal with Olive Drab anti-glare panel. Wing, tail, stabilizer tips and prop hub are Red. Note antenna forward of windscreen. Some sources mention the engine nacelles to be Olive Drab. Our photos do not show the nacelles. Aircraft used for electronic countermeasures.
