Fw 190 D-9s JG 4, JG 6, JG 26, JG 51

To compliment the newly released Hasegawa 1/32nd scale D-9 kit, presented here are four very colorful aircraft, also offered in 1/72nd and 1/48th scale. These models can be enhanced by using EagleParts available in 1/48th and 1/32nd scales. "Black 1" W. Nr. 210003 "Black 1" W. Nr. 210003 14./JG 26 (IV. Gruppe) March 1945 Varrelbusch, Germany
This was the third D-9 delivered. Originally tested and adjusted at Rechlin then issued to Oblt. Hans Dortenmann. Aircraft survived the war but was blown up by Dortenmann at the end of hostilities. Early style 5-piece gun cowl with bump, EP #42-32 resin gun cowling recommended.

Colors: Undersurfaces: RLM 76 Light Blue, Uppersurfaces: RLM 82 Bright Green/RLM 83 Dark Green. Spinner: Black/White spiral. Prop

blades: RLM 70 Black-Green. Latch buttons: Red. Cowl underside and rudder: Yellow, Fuselage retains early Black/White cross after February 1945 repaint of scheme in EC#21. Retrofitted with blown canopy. All antennas intact.

National Markings: Fusclage: Early A-8 style 800 mm Black/White crosses.

Hakenkreuz: Originally Black/White overpainted to 420 mm standard.

Wings: Upper; B6 style 910 mm White crosses. Lower; B4 style 900 mm Black outline crosses.

Steneiling: Unusual primer filler steneiling (see photo). Unusual B4 octane triangle. Remainder unknown.

Stenciling: Unusual primer filter stencining (see photo).

References: Original photo published inside instruction sheet. Summer 1945 Bayreuth-Bindlach, Germany Though the Werknummer is unknown, it has the characteristics of a 600 series Fieseler-built Dora. All antennas intact and flat canopy (provisional). Three piece gun cowl, no bump on rear or edges. EP#42-32 resin gun cowling recommended, remove small bumps off cowl.

Colors: Undersurfaces: RLM 76. Uppersurfaces: RLM 75/RLM 83. Blaugrün camouflage spots on engine cowling, slightly darker in value than RLM 76 undersurfaces. Dark Green spot on starboard upper wing top view, may be dirt or debris. JG 4 Black/White/Black RV bands on rear fuselage, White portion of the band oversprayed with Blaugrun. A spot of Blaugrun covers a previous bar aft of the cross. Blaugrūn possibly oversprayed on the fuselage spine between RV band and cross. Spinner: Black/White spiral. Prop Blades: RLM 70

National Markings: Fuselage: B5 style 600 mm White outline crosses filled with RLM 83. Hakenkreuz: Black H3 530 mm (provisional). Wings: Upper; B6 style 910 mm White outline crosses. Lower, B1b style 900 mm solid black crosses (provisional). Stenciling: Factory standard.

Three piece gun cowl, no bumps on rear, only on lower edges. EP#42-32 resin gun cowling recommended. Pilot: Unknown.

Colors: Fuselage undersurfaces: Blaugriin, Wing underside: natural metal with leading edge and landing gear doors RLM 75. Patches of RLM 76 and Red primer on landing gear door at attachment points. Outboard portion of starboard wing underside from the cross to the wingtip appears to be overpainted in RLM 76 including the outboard portion of the cross. See bottom view. Red primer or dark Gray putty lines on some panels is visible on the underside of the wing. Ailerons RLM 76. Uppersurfaces fuselage: RLM 81/RLM 83. In an attempt to "Green up" the overall camouflage, study reveals RLM 82 Bright Green has been softly oversprayed on the RLM 83 engine cowling. This left some light overspray on the rear portion of spinner and prop blades in RLM 82. Red primer circle around rear jack hole on both sides. Some areas including forward portion of tail fin and fuselage extension appear to be freshly hand-brushed in a dark color possibly RLM 81 or 83. Spots on gun cowl appear to be paint that has flaked off. Upper wing and horizontal tail appear to have a base color of Light Gray. Spinner: Black/White spiral. Prop Blades: RLM 70 Black Green. All Red trim tabs appear to be painted over except on the rudder.

National Markings: Fuselage: B4 style 800 mm Black outline crosses. Hakenkreuz: Black H3 420 mm.

Wings: Upper, B6 style 910 mm White outline crosses. Lower, B1 style 900 mm solid Black crosses.

Note: Starboard under wing cross partially missing.

Stenciling: Factory standard. Note: White E9 on ionward possess.

Indication of D.9s assembled from sub-contracted parts. Blown canopy. All This D-9 is one of two in this Werknummer Block, Unpainted pieces indicative of D-9s assembled from sub-contracted parts. Blown canopy. All antennas intact. This aircraft was one of those that surrendered at Flensberg from IV/JG 51. Three piece gun cowling, no bumps on rear or edges. EP#42-32 resin gun cowling recommended, remove small bumps off cowl. Colors: Undersurfaces: Probably RLM 76 Light Blue. Under wing leading edge and gear doors appear to be RLM 75. Under cowling stained

and weathered, Uppersurfaces: RLM 82 Bright Green/RLM 83 Dark Green, Spinner and Propeller blades: RLM 70 Black-Green, Interior of flaps, MG 131-13 mm gun cowling, and MG 151-20 mm inboard cannon access panels: Natural metal.

National Markings: Fuselage: B4 style 800 mm Black crosses. Hakenkreuz: Black H3 420 mm.

Wings: Upper B6 style 910 mm White crosses. Lower B1b style 900 mm solid Black crosses.

Stenciling: Not visible in photos, probably factory standard. Werknummer on both sides of fin. References: Photos published inside instruction sheet.

National Markings: Fuselage; B4 style 800 mm Black crosses, Hakenkreuz: Black H3 420 mm

Wings: Upper; B6 style 910 mm White crosses, Lower; B1b style 900 mm solid Black crosses.

Stenciling: Not visible in photos, probably Factory Standard. Werknummer on both sides of fin. Reference: Photos published inside instruction sheet
