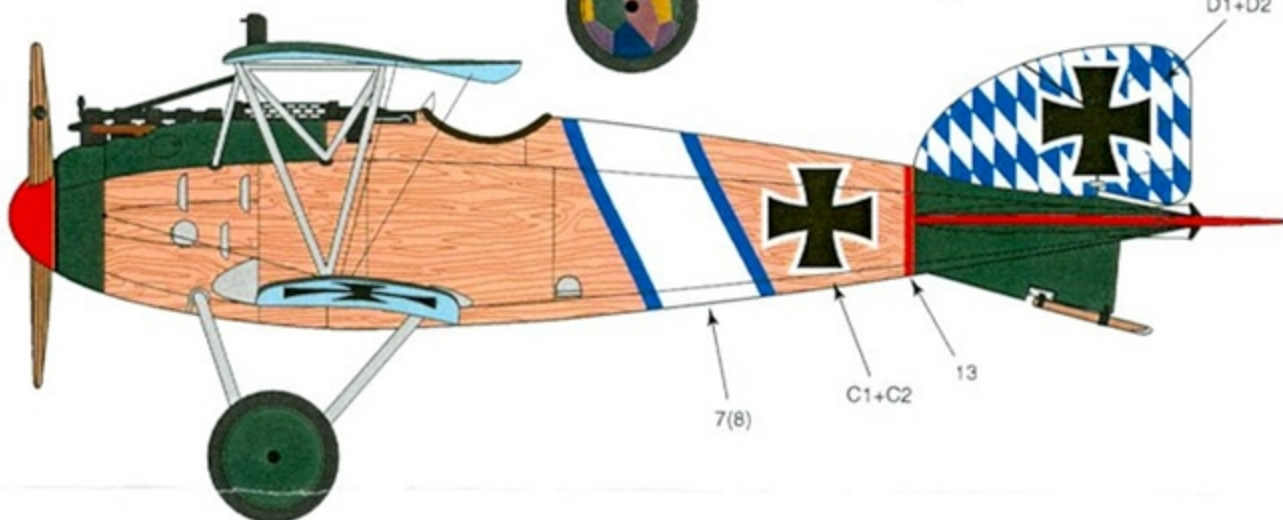
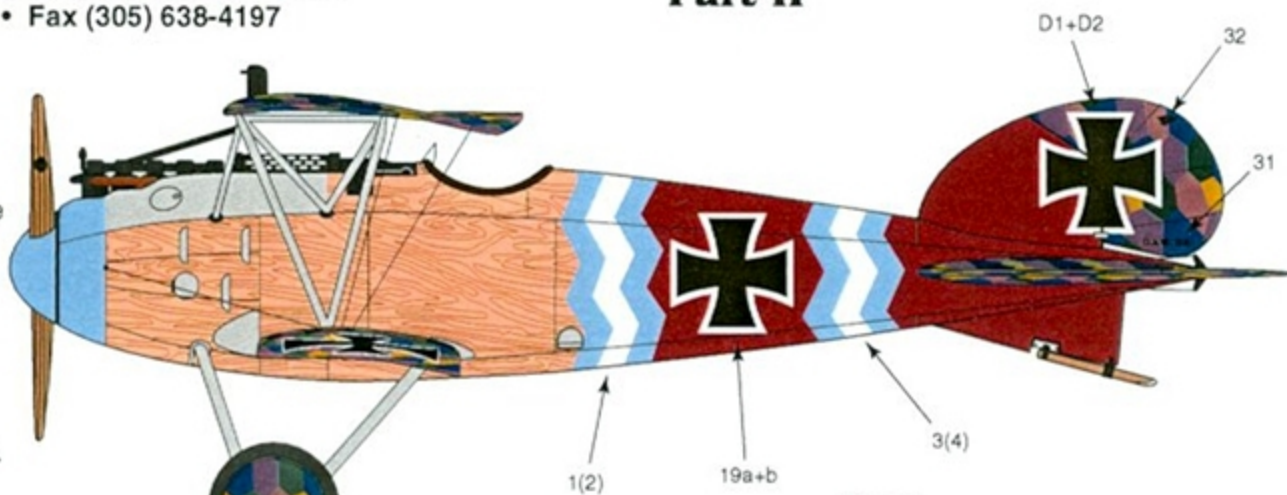

Albatros D.III (OAW)

Jasta 49, 1917. Clear varnished plywood fuselage. Wings and horizontal tailplane covered with 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric. Wheel covers and rudder covered with under surface lozenge camouflage fabric. Light gray struts and metal panels. Black spinner and black and white wheel covers.

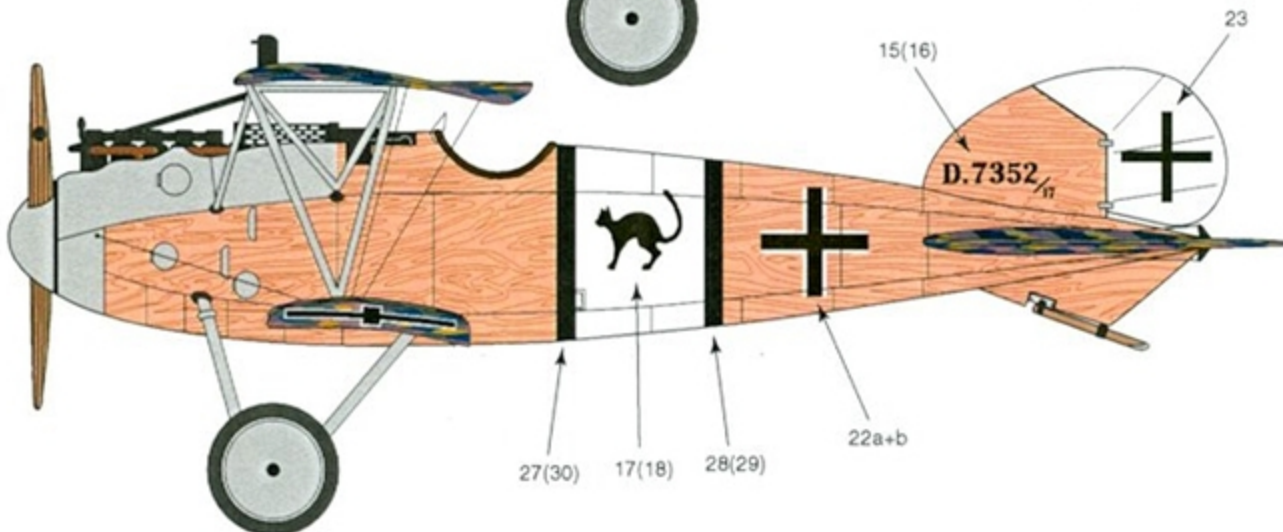
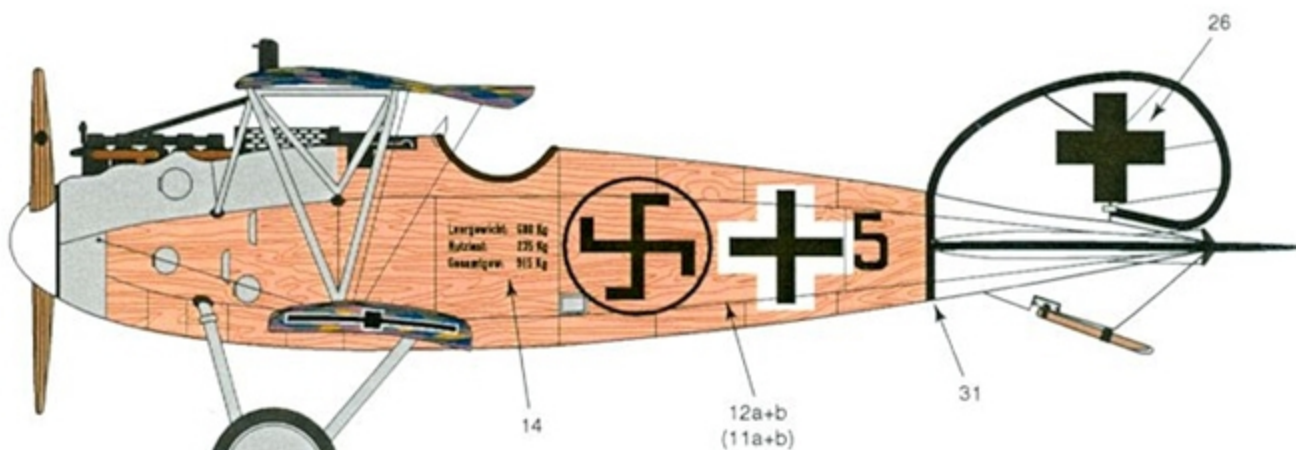


Albatros D.III

Jasta 5, 1917. Clear varnished plywood fuselage. Dark green and mauve camouflage on upper surfaces of both wings, with light blue under surfaces. Rear of fuselage and horizontal tailplane dark green with red trim. Light gray struts. Red spinner. Wheel covers dark green.

Albatros D.Va

Jasta 43, 1918, flown by Lt. Josef Raesch. Clear varnished plywood fuselage. Wings covered with 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric (wing cross style uncertain). Tail white with black trim. Light gray struts, wheel covers and metal panels. White spinner.



Albatros D.Va, D.7352/17

Jasta 59, 1918, flown by Lt. Lehmann. Clear varnished plywood fuselage. Wings and horizontal tailplane covered with 4 or 5 color lozenge camouflage fabric. Black/white/black fuselage band. White rudder. Light gray struts, spinner, wheel covers, and metal panels.
