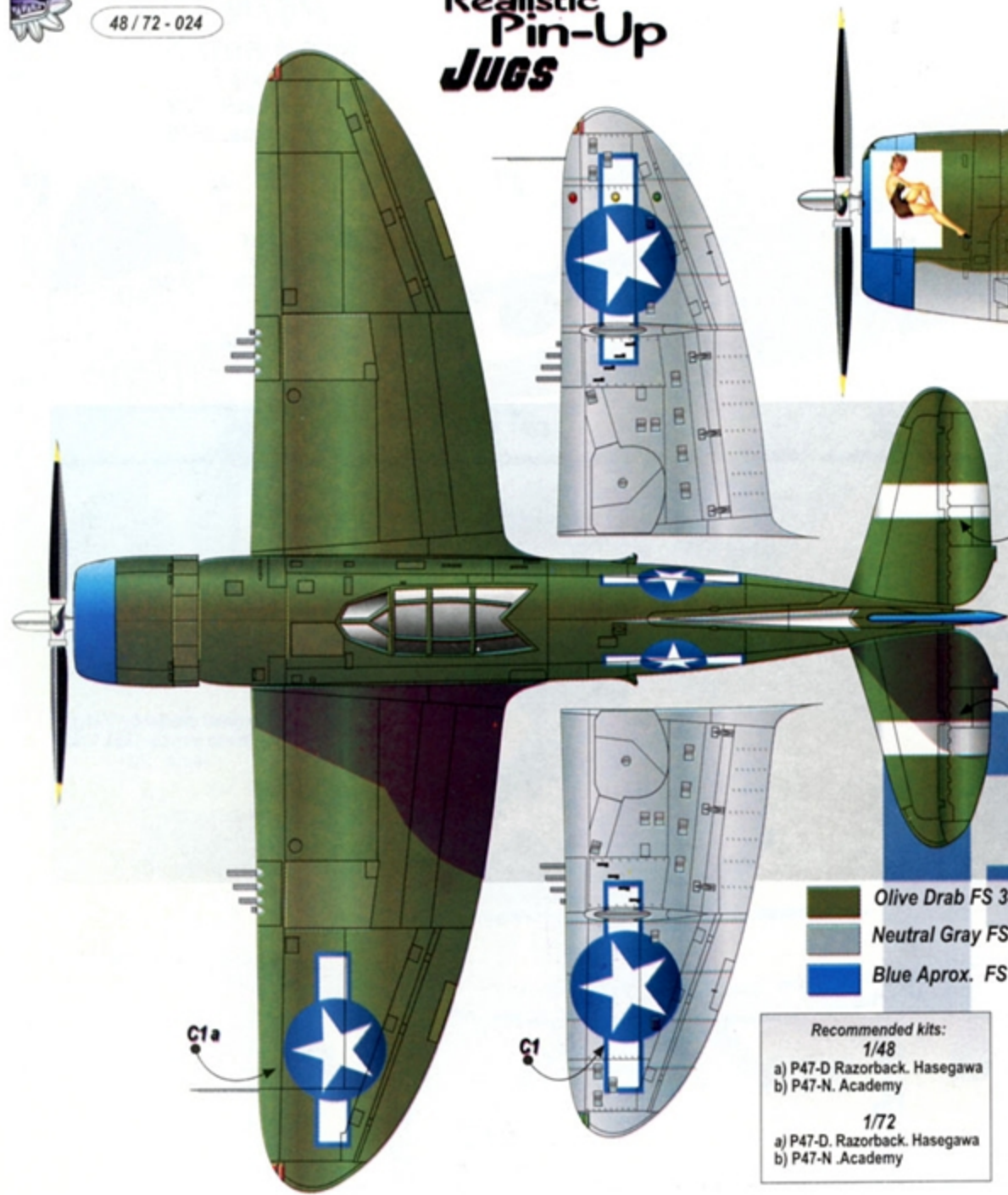

During the WWII the pilots and mechanics of the different airplanes and units, found endless quantities of reasons to decorate their airplanes. These drawings finally represented desires, and yearnings to return to their homes and to always show the personality of the crew and its spirit of competition and survival. Inspired by Artists like Varga (Alberto Vargas), Gil Elvgren, George Petty, soon the airplanes were decorated with voluptuous pictures and drawings of idealized women, commonly known as "Pin-Up" art. In some cases these drawings were more than simple copies, only to become masterfull recreations of the original ones, mainly, considering, the limited conditions in the aerial fields.

These series of transfers are dedicated to reproduce the most beautiful motives, found on the photographic references, trying with it, to contribute to the enormous effort that make the modelers in order to build their models with an accurate fidelity as is possible; that is the mainly reason, and the most important point, that we have as a motive, to reproduce this "Pin-Up" art, as accurate as is possible to the real stuff, without being satisfied with the tradicional transfer printing, which is always limited by the quantity of color and the quality of impression.

Been this work, a respectful homage to all those that during the WWII, gave us reasons to recreate with their airplanes and their girls.
