
White 5, the mount of Uffz. Rudolf Hübl, of I/JG 1 was an Fw-190A-6. It was destroyed after combat with US B-17's. Wearing standard RLM 74/75/76 camouflage colors, this colorful A/C had a checkerboard cowling with Yellow undersurfaces and Black spinner/cowl ring combination. The serial number was 550490 and it had Hübl's personal markings depicting the famous prewar German comedian "Grog".

White 20, Fw-190A-7, W.Nr 340035. Major Emil Rudolf Schnoor flew this A/C to achieve 23 victories. This machine was belly landed near Detmold on April 16, 1944. Wearing the same camouflage as A/C 1, it had stripes rather than checkers on the front cowling. Schnoor was the Gruppen-Kommandeur of I/JG 1 during March/April 1944. His personal markings, a double M, refers to his wife. He still shows it today on his car!

White 10, an early Fw-190A-4, W.Nr 583, was flown by Ofw Fritz Husser of I/JG 1. This A/C was lost on July 8, 1943, also fighting B-17's. It is camouflaged as A/C 1, but without the checkers.

Decaling the checkered cowlings:

- 1. Paint White and Yellow area of the cowling White. Mask of the White area and paint the lower panel Yellow (RLM 04). Finish your paint job, remove all the masking. Gloss over the entire area.
- 2. Now you are ready for decaling. Apply decals 1L and 1R, carefully aligning them with the panel/hinge line above the cowl side blister. Your top checks will fit perfectly overlapping each other.
- 3. Next apply 3L and 3R, edging the forward portion of the blister. Align the top and bottom section to completely enclose the forward part of the blister.
- Repeat the same procedure with parts 4L and 4R, but at the rear of the blister. At this time your cowl blister should be enclosed by parts 3L and 11L and 3R and 11R.
- 5. Apply the three parts #2 on the lower cowl ring, spacing them evenly. Allow to dry. Wash your model.
- 6. With a fine brush, Black paint and a steady hand, fill in the blisters front and rear checks.
- 7. Finish decaling your model. These checks have been measured to perfectly fit the Tamiya kit. Happy Modeling.
