





Medium Sea Gray colors - but in a non-standard pattern. Note conversion of the earlier 42" Type A1 fuselage roundel to Type C1 proportions - as well as the unfaired canons and canopy blister. Sky spinner and 18" fuselage band. This A/C also had chordwise, 1 ft. Yellow bands aft of the inboard cannons on upper and lower wings (decals 20, 20a, 21, 21a).



No. 609 Sqn. Ldr. R.P. Beamont's Typhoon, R7752/PR*G wears standard day fighter camouflage - but with an odd mix of a White chin flash, 42" Type C1 fuselage roundels, earlier 42" Type A underwing insignia and converted 24"x27" fin flashes. Note the unusual Yellow cannon fairings and prop spinner. It also carried four 1 ft. wide Black-on-White I.D. stripes beneath the wings. Left side reads PR OG.



A colorful Typhoon of No. 182 Sqn. in Nov., 1942, R8893/XM*M wears RAF day fighter camouflage supplemented by a White nose & spinner, four 1 ft.wide Black I.D. stripes beneath the wing and 1 ft.wide Yellow bands across the top wing, aft of the inboard cannon fairing (decals 20 & 21). Note the unfaired cannon with temporary canvas covers, used only while on the ground. Left side reads XM OM.



AeroMaster Decals.

No. 609 Sqn.'s Typhoon, DN406/PR*F ("Mavis"), sports standard day fighter camouflage with a White chin flash. Note the Sky/Red prop spinner, 18" Sky fuselage band and four 1 ft.-wide Black-on-White I.D. stripes beneath the wings. Notice white flash on lower radiator (see bottom view). Left side reads PROF.
