





Mosquito FB Mk.VI HX922/EG-F 487 Squadron RNZAF, 140 Wing, 2 Group, 2nd. TAF. 18 February 1944. Group Captain Percy Pickard DSO, DFC and Flight Lieutenant Bill Broadly DSO, DFC, DFM. EG-F was the commander's aircraft

for the now legendary raid on Amiens Prison. While successfully releasing 700 prisoners from the jail, both pilot and navigator died during the mission. The aircraft was painted overall Medium Sea Grey with Dark Green camouflage applied to upper surfaces and Sky spinners. Right side reads EG ⊚ F.





Mosquito NF Mk.II DZ228/YP-D 23 Squadron, Luqa, Malta, Autumn 1943. This was the first Mosquito squadron to serve in the Mediterranean theatre, flying intruder missions over Southern Italy and Sicily. Upper surfaces were camouflaged in Dark Green and Medium Sea Grey. Under surfaces were painted Smooth Night Black and the spinners were Red. Right side reads $D \odot YP$.

Mosquito FB Mk.VI RF784/UX-N 45 Squadron, Jaori, Arakan, India 1945. UX-N operated "Rhubarb" patrols against road and rail targets during Operation "Dracula" - the re-taking of Rangoon, Burma. Painted overall Silver with Red spinners, the aircraft also carried the Black SEAC theatre recognition bands on wings, tail and fin. Right side reads N © UX.
