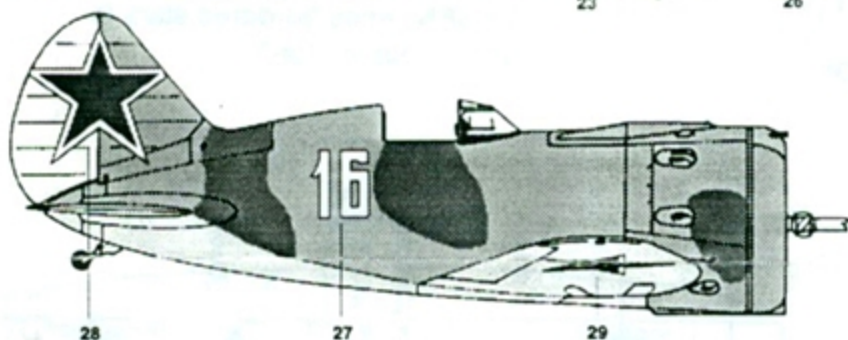

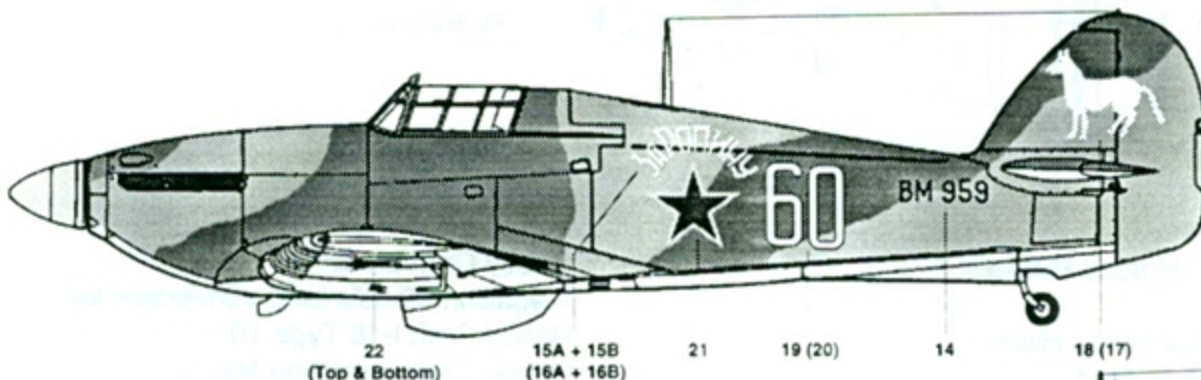
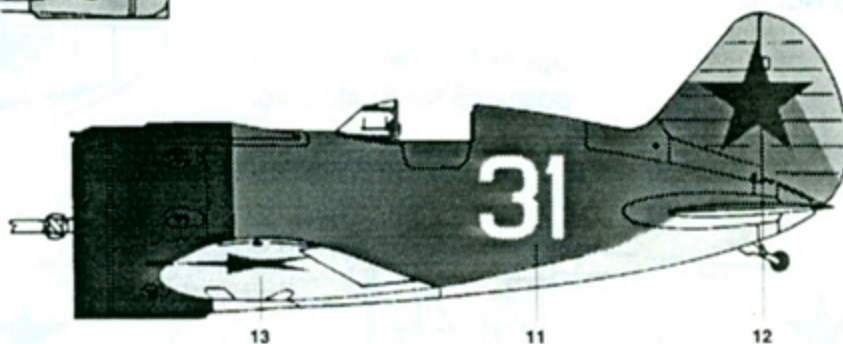
Lavochkin LaG-5, No. 15, 3rd Gv.IAP, Soviet Air Force, Leningrad, 1945. Flown by Capt. Gregori Kostylev. Soviet dark green and light blue camouflage. Rudder and spinner yellow. Inside of mouth area black. Use template provided on reverse.

Lavochkin La-5FN, No. 15, 159th IAP, Leningrad, 1944. Flown by Capt. P. Likholetov. Dark and light grey camouflage with light blue undersides. Spinner and rudder white. Panel aft of exhaust is stained natural metal.



Polikarpov I-16 Type 10, No. 16, 21st Guards IAP. Flown by Sr. Lt. A. Lomakin, Leningrad, 1943. Dark green and black green upper surfaces with light blue lower surfaces. Rudder silver.

Polikarpov I-16 Type 10, No. 31, Finland, 1943. Upper surfaces dark green with light blue lower surfaces. Cowling Black. Upper portion of vertical stabilizer yellow.



Hurricane Mk. IIb, BM959, No. 60, Finland, 1942. Standard British camouflage pattern in dark green and ocean grey with medium sea grey undersides. Spinner sky. Outboard leading edges of wings yellow.

Spitfire Mk. VB, No. 65, Soviet Air Force, 1945. Camouflage appears to have been repainted in colors similar to British dark green and ocean grey with azure blue undersides. No evidence of overpainting of British insignias. Spinner white and red.
