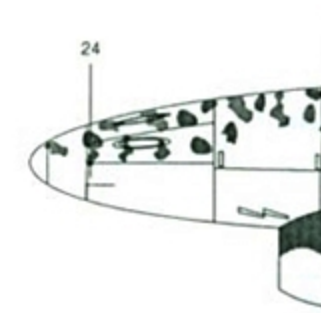
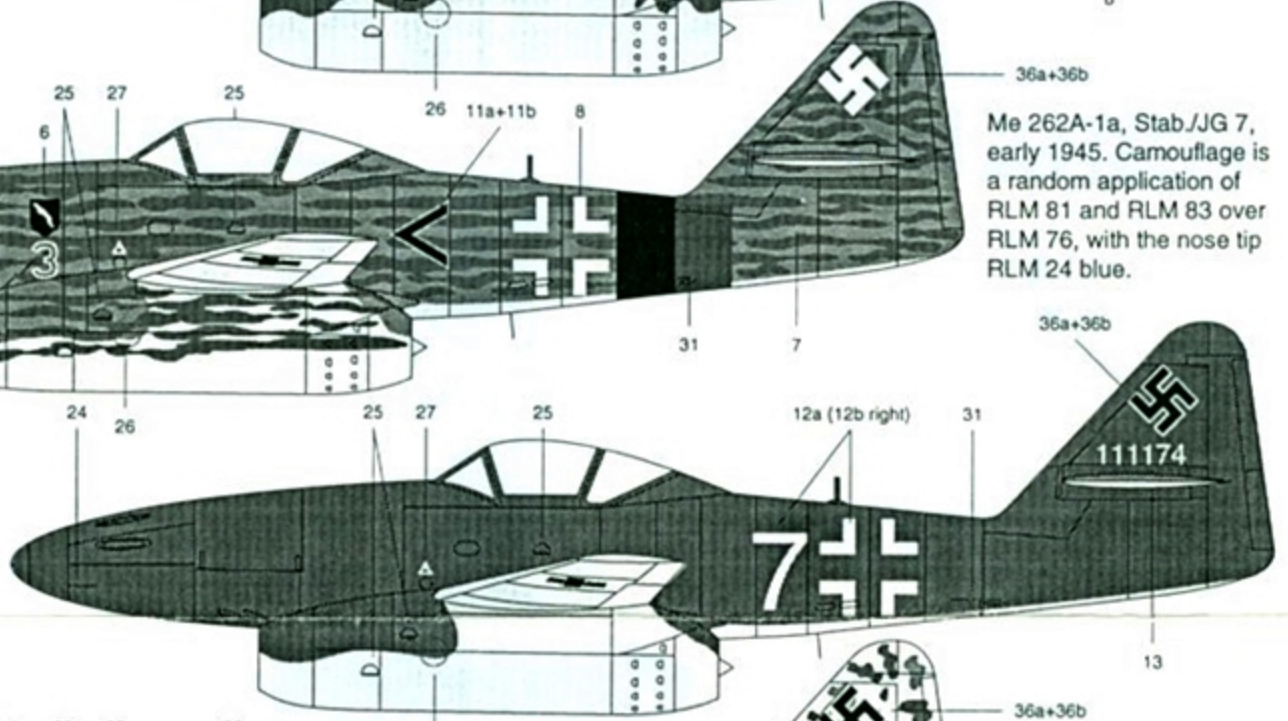

 over RLM 76.



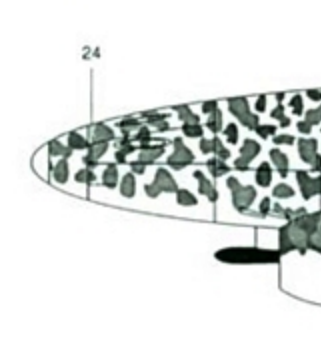
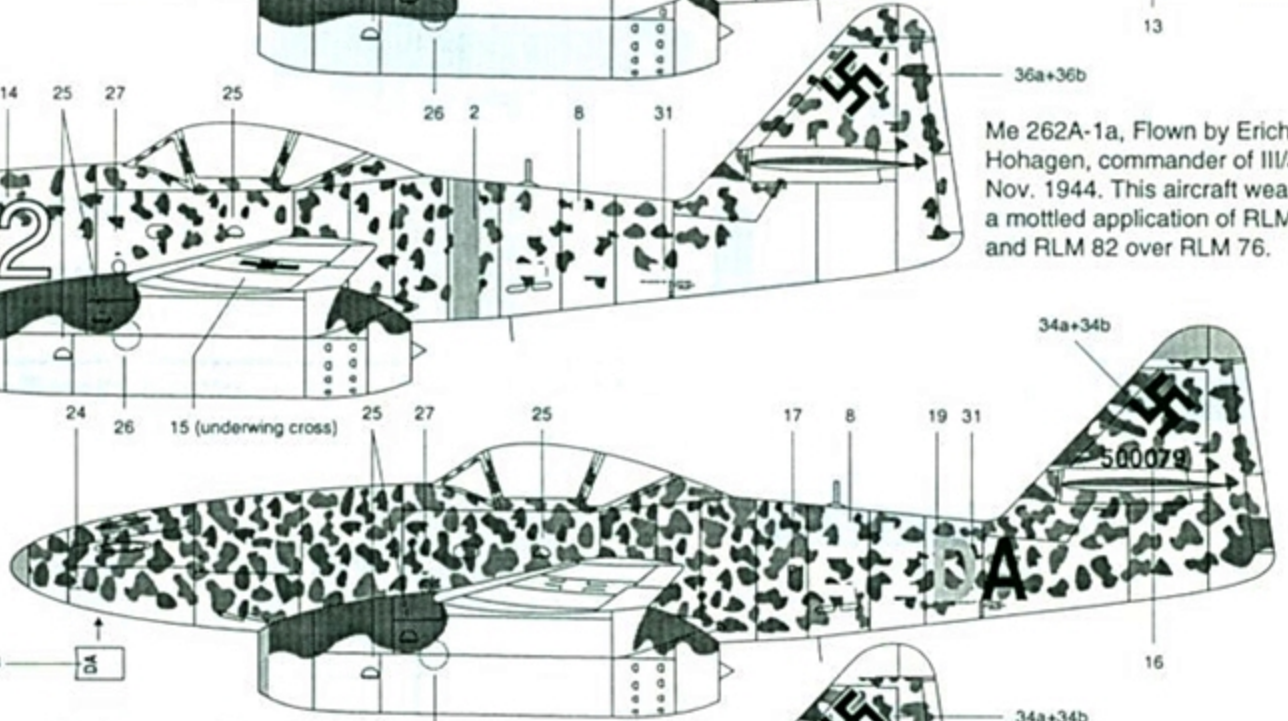
Me 262A-1a, Stab/JG 7,

 over RLM 76.

 Nov. 1944. This aircraft wears
 a mottled application of RLM 81
 and RLM 82 over RLM 76.

 of Stab./KG 76, May 1945.
 Camouflage is RLM 82 and
 RLM 83 over RLM 76, with
 tip of fin and nose green
 with thin white outlines.
 Nacelle leading edges are
 green.



Me 262A-2a, of Kommando
 Schenk. W.Nr. 170096, 1/KG 51,
 Late 1944. Camouflage is RLM 81
 and RLM 83 over RLM 76, with
 tip of fin and nose white. Outer
 gun troughs also sport a thin white
 outline.
