

strip was covered with Red paint. Hamilton Standard propeller. Codes on right side





P-47D-22-RE 42-26387 of the 82nd FS, 78th FG, 8th AF, based at Duxford, England, November 1944.



P-47D-30-RE (44-20904)34 Squadron, Meiktila, 1945.



Aircraft overall weathered Natural Metal finish with Dark Green anti-glare panel and Dark (roundel) Blue SEAC bands around cowl, wings and Curtiss Electric 836 propeller.



P-47D-28-RE 44-19562, Rat A Dat 3, 350th FS, 353rd FG, 8th AF. Flown by Lt Ken Gallup during the late summer of 1944.

Based at Raydon, England. Natural Metal finish with Black and Yellow diamonds on cowl. Invasion stripes on lower fuselage. Invasion stripes and Blue-bordered national insignia probably carried under both wings. Note 13' Curtiss-Electric propeller. Small Black triangles complete the diamonds inside the cowling. Modeller may have to trim a little for a perfect fit.
