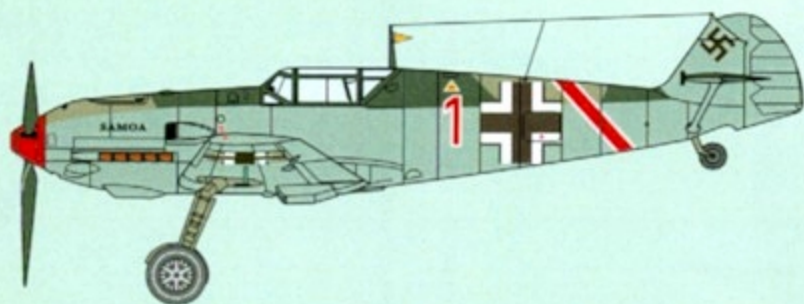

## Attack in the West Pt. II



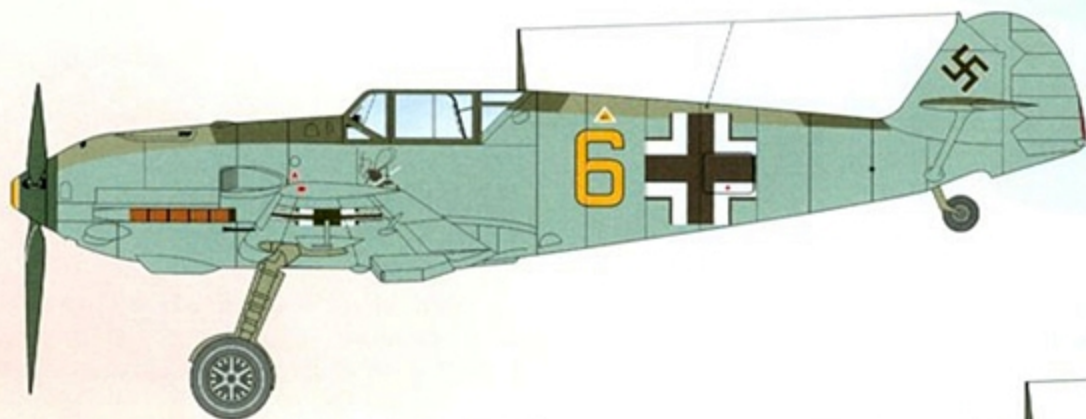
Suggested Kit: Hasegawa, Tamiya, Hobbycraft Bf-109E Family

Bf-109E-1 flown by Oberleutnant Fritz Losigkeit, Staffelkapitän of 2/JG 26, Werl, March 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 70 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. RLM 70 spinner.

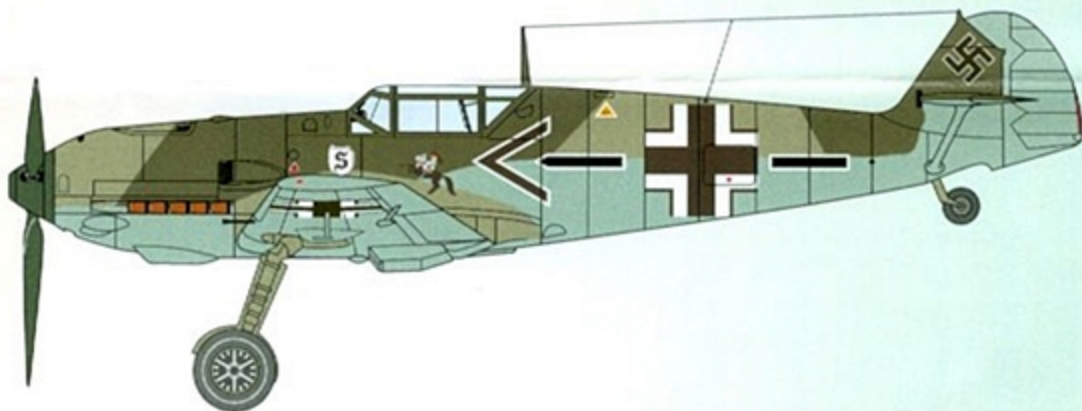
Note: Devil's head may have been Gray (supplied) instead of Red. See page 310 and use your judgement. Notice fuselage cross in the picture is smaller than standard. Manufacture Red pennant out of aluminum foil and paint Red.



Bf-109E-4 flown by Fw. Christoph Schugmann of 3/JG 3. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Yellow tip of spinner. Wasp badge carried on left side only.



Bf-109E-3 flown by Oberstleutnant Hans-Hugo Witt, Geschwaderkommodore of JG 26, April 1940. Camouflaged in an unusual combination of RLM 71 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. RLM 70 spinner. We are not sure if the "knight" is carried on the starboard side and in which direction it would face. Several options included.



Bf-109E-1 flown by Oberleutnant Gert Framm, Staffelkapitän of 2/JG 27, spring 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 70 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. Red spinner. Modeller must manufacture pennant (see A/C 1).



Bf-109 E-1 flown by Hptm. Hannes Trautloft, Kommandeur of 1/JG 20, Bonninghardt, April 1940. Camouflaged in splinter pattern of RLM 70 and RLM 02 over RLM 65. RLM 70 spinner. "Axe from Lower Rhine" badge on right side only.
