




6N+IH Wk Nr 5105 is a He 111 H-1

VG-ES W.N:4 408S is an H-4 operated by Kurierstaffel, zb v Africa, It is most probable that this muchine was the personal transport of General Field Marshal Erwin Romann. The aircraft has ost in a crash at Ante Gazalo on the 9th August 1941. Alternaft is finished in RLM 78/7980 with regulation tail and main wheels having white washed sides. Note that no badge exists on the left side of the cochpit as suggested by the Kaperp publication belinkel; He II 11 o. I What does exist here however is the fine loctant traingled directly above the black manufactures plate. Photograph shows the spinner tips to be in the Salffel colour of RLM 04 but the unit badge is unfortunately hidden from view. KG 26 seem to have been more consistent with such an application than other units and so a badge has been drawn in its usual position. Note that this is a nearly H-6 with metal JVDM air screens and smaller spinner. Also note the slightly lower down demacration line of the aft fixed-gae camouflage. 
