Hs 129s

This extremely strong, rugged, ungainly looking but efficient aircraft, the Henschel Hs 129 was the only Luftwaffe aircraft designed exclusively for use as a tank killer in both Africa and Eastern Front. Minimal stencilling included therefore it is suggested modeler use kit-supplied stencilling decals for all aircraft.

Hs 129 B-2 "Blue A" W. Nr. 0296 4.(Pz)/Sch.G 2 Pilot: Unknown 1942-1943 El Adem, Libva

After crash-landing at El Adem, this aircraft was captured by the RAF. The aircraft was equipped with a Mk 101 cannon and radio antenna mast, Uppersurfaces; Originally 70 Black-Green, 71 Dark Green splinter pattern overpainted with 79 Sand-Colors: Undersurfaces; 65 Bright Blue

Yellow I Italian with 80 Olive-Green spots. White Mediterranean Theater fuselage band, underwing tips and nose section.

Exterior gun sight Dark Gray probably 66 Black-Gray.

Spinner, Tips White with 1/3 Blue segment, rear portion Black-Green Prop blades: 70 Black-Green

National Markings: Fusclage; B3 Black and White crosses, H2a Hakenkreuz Black with White outline

Wings: Upper - B1a crosses Lower - B2 crosses

Stencilling: Unknown. Reference indicates Tank Assault Badge on nose section however this cannot be substantiated in photos therefore the Infantry Assault Badge is supplied.

Hs 129 B-2 W. Nr. 0364 Pilot: Unknown 8.(Pz)/Sch.G 1 May 1943 Kuban, Russia

This aircraft was equipped with the Mk 101 cannon, no radio antenna mast.

Colors: Undersurfaces; 65 Bright Blue Uppersurfaces; 70 Black-Green, 71 Dark Green splinter pattern, heavily weathered.

Yellow Eastern Front Threater fuselage band, underwing tips, undercowlings and nose section.

Exterior gun sight Dark Gray probably 66 Black-Gray.

Spinner: Front portion 23 Red, thin White stripe, rear portion 70 Black-Green or Black. Prop Blades: 70 Black-Green

National Markings: Fuselage; B5 White outline cross, H2a. Hakenkreuz Black with White outline.

Wings: Upper - probably B6 crosses Lower - B2 crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard. Infantry Assault Badge on nose section.

Pilot: Oblt. Georg Dornemann 10.(Pz)/Sch.G 9 July 1943 W. Nr. 140830 Russian Front

This aircraft was equipped with the Mk 103 cannon, no radio antenna mast.

Colors: Undersurfaces; 65 Bright Blue Uppersurfaces; 70 Black-Green, 71 Dark Green splinter pattern.

Yellow Eastern Front Threater fuselage band, underwing tips, and nose section.

Exterior gun sight Dark Gray probably 66 Black-Gray.

Spinner: Front portion 23 Red, thin White stripe, rear portion 70 Black-Green or Black. Prop Blades: 70 Black-Green

National Markings: Fuselage; B5 White outline cross, H2a Hakenkreuz Black with White outline.

Wings: Upper - probably B6 crosses Lower - B2 crosses

Stencilling: Factory standard. Infantry Assault Badge on nose section.

"Purple X" Hs 129 B-2 W. Nr. 0278 Pilot: Unknown 8.(Pz)/Sch,G 2 1943 El Aouina, Tunisia

This aircraft was equipped with the Mk 101 cannon, and has radio antenna mast.

Colors: Undersurfaces; 65 Bright Blue Uppersurfaces, 70 Black-Green, 71 Dark Green splinter pattern, oversprayed with 79 Sand-Yellow I Italian

White Mediterranean Theater fuselage band, and underwing tips. Fuselage crosses and White band partially oversprayed.

Exterior gun sight Dark Gray probably 66 Black-Gray.

Spinner: 70 Black-Green with 79 Sand-Yellow I Italian overspray; Prop Blades: 70 Black-Green

National Markings: Fuselage; B2 crosses, H2a Hakenkreuz Black with White outline.

Wings: Upper - B1a Crosses. Lower - B2 crosses

Stencilling: Unknown.
