# Aeromaster Battle of Britain 

Supermarine Spitfire Mk.I P9495 DW-K 610 (County of Chester) Squadron, Biggin Hill July 1940. One of the most illustrated Battle of Britain Spitfires, P9495 wears the B Pattern of the Temperate Land Scheme camouflage and a 'Duck Egg Blue' shade on its under surfaces.


Supermarine Spitfire Mk.I N3093 QJ-W 'THE VIRGIN'. Flight Lieutenant Denys Gillam. 616 (South Yorkshire) Squadron, Leconfield, August 1940. N3093 has a unit applied under surface colour of Light Blue. Note F/Lt. Gillam's personal cartoon below the cockpit. This aircraft also still carries the pre-war codes of QJ and is the second aircraft with the letter W.

Supermarine Spitfire Mk.IIa P8194 DL-M 'GOLD COAST I'. Flight Lieutenant Don Mackay. 91 (Nigeria) Squadron, Hawkinge. April/May 1940. P8194 was one of numerous 'presentation' aircraft. As a means to aid the war effort, towns, cities and colonies of the British Empire would raise money to sponsor


Spitfire Mk.II, P7531 LZ-I, 421 Flight, RAF Hawkinge. November 1940. Flown by S/Ldr C. Greene, DSO \& DFC. RAF Dark Earth, Dark Green \& Sky camouflage (Type A pattern) with black spinner. Fin flashes have $7^{\prime \prime}$ stripe widths.
