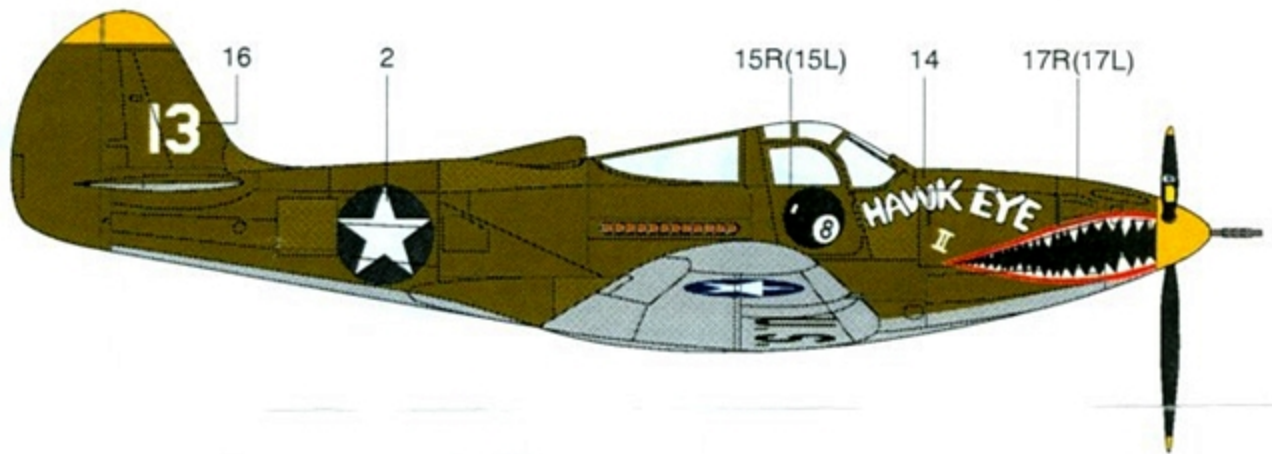

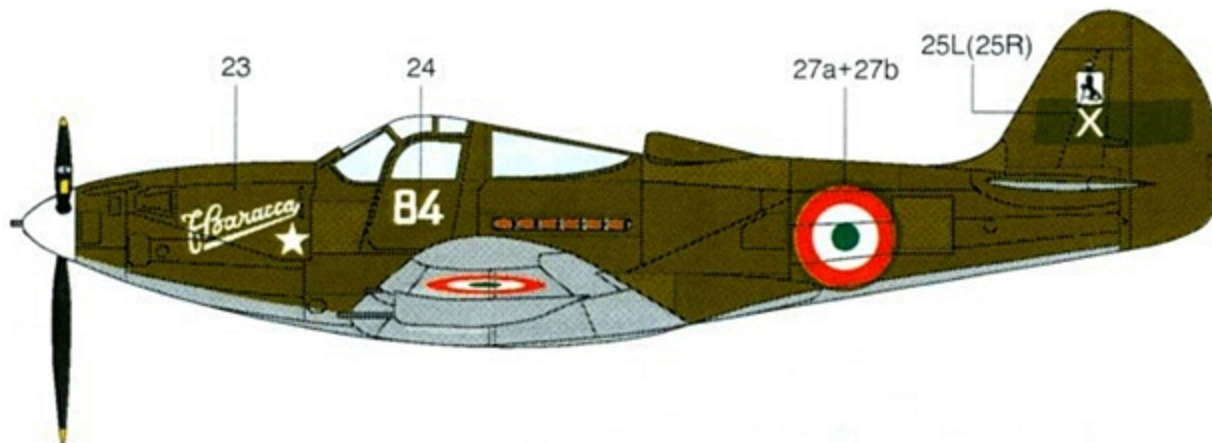
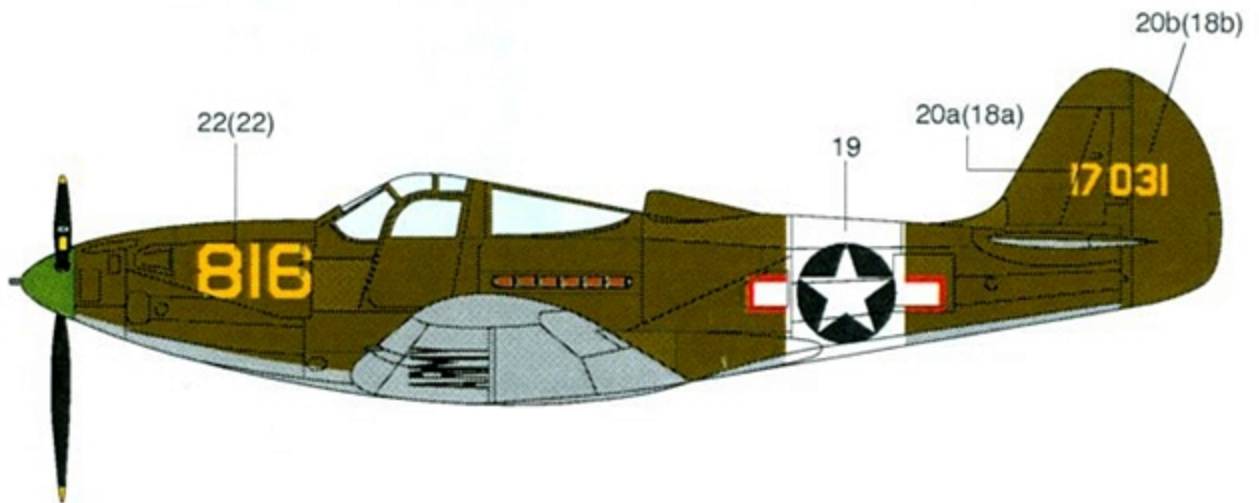


Bell P-400 of the 347th FG, 67th FS, 13th US Army Air Force, Guadalcanal, 1942. Like all the 46 A/C received by the 347 FG, these airplanes were originally consigned to the RAF, and carried British serial numbers in the BW108-183 range, as well as Dark Earth and Dark Green upper camouflage with a Lighter Sky Blue undersurfaces. White wing tips and spinner finished the decoration.

Bell P-400, US Army Air Force, New Guinea, 1942. Regulation U.S. camouflage consists of Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43. Propeller spinner and fin tip are yellow.



Bell P-39D-2 of the 51st USAAF FG, North Africa, 1943. Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43 standard camouflage scheme. Spinner is bright green of an unknown specific shade.



Bell P-39Q of the 4^a Stormo C.T., Italian Co-Belligerent Air Force, 1945. Olive Drab 41 over Neutral Gray 43 standard camouflage scheme. Note that the original USAAF markings are painted-out in Italian olive green, and that the spinner is white.
