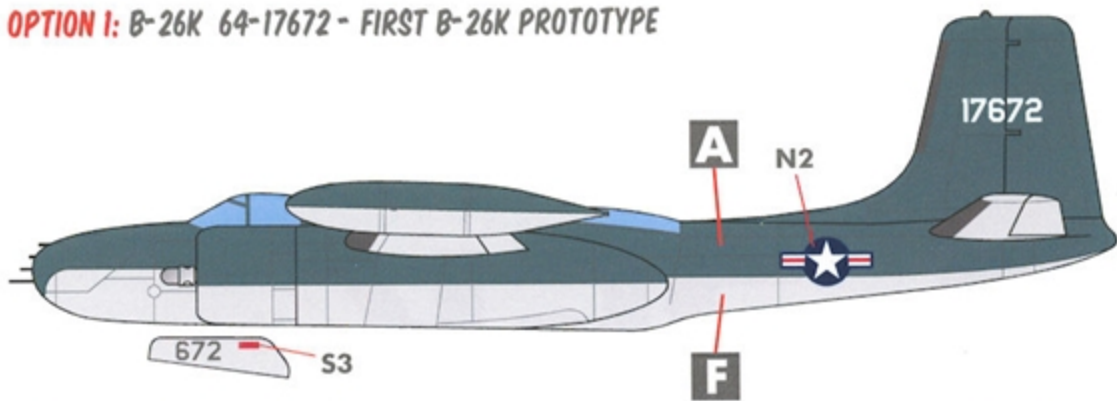

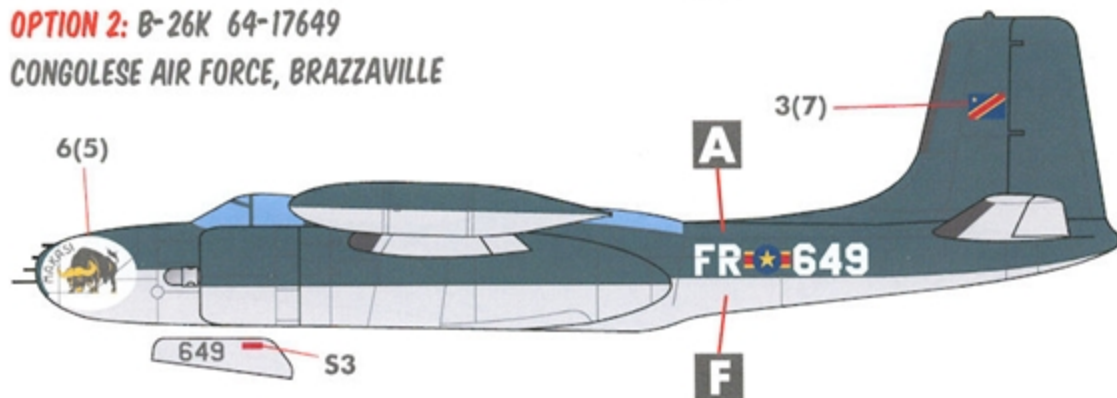

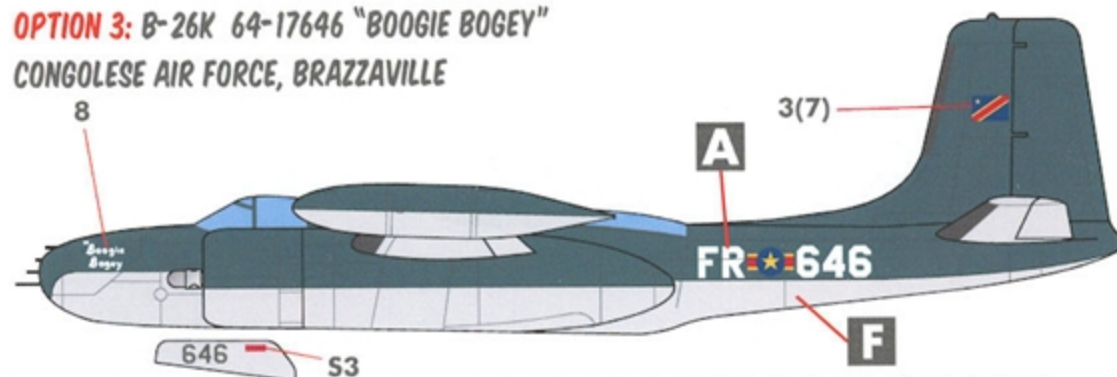
OPTION 1: B-26K 64-17672 - FIRST B-26K PROTOTYPE

CONGOLESE AIR FORCE, BRAZZAVILLE

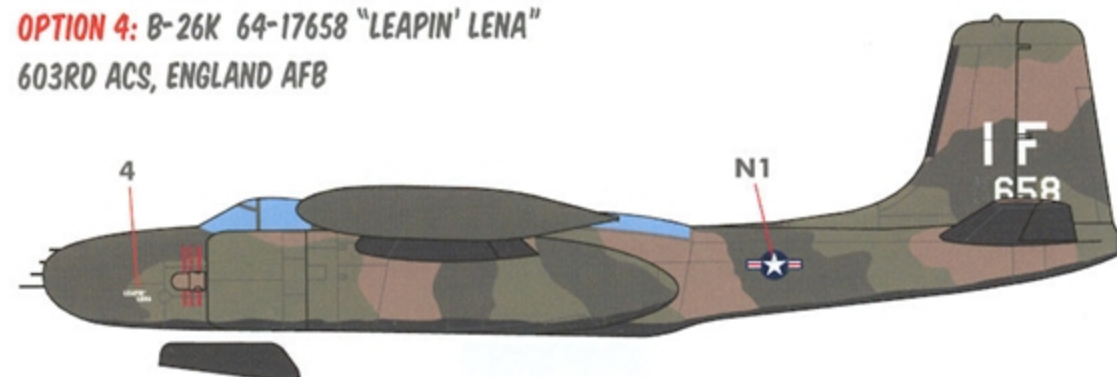

CONGOLESE AIR FORCE, BRAZZAVILLE



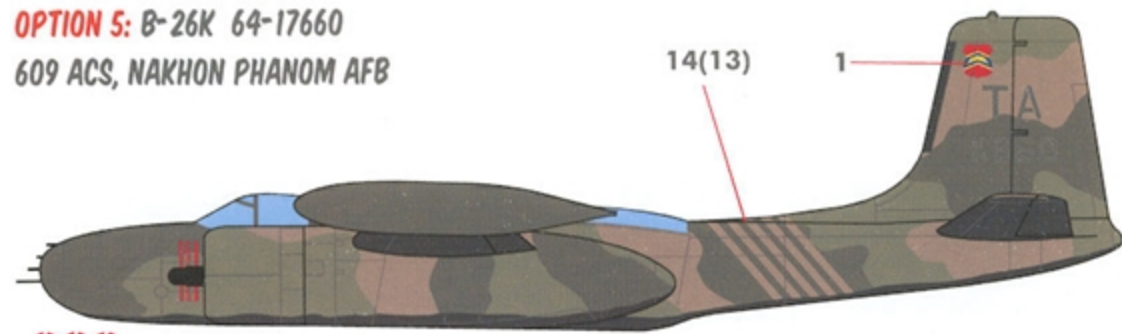

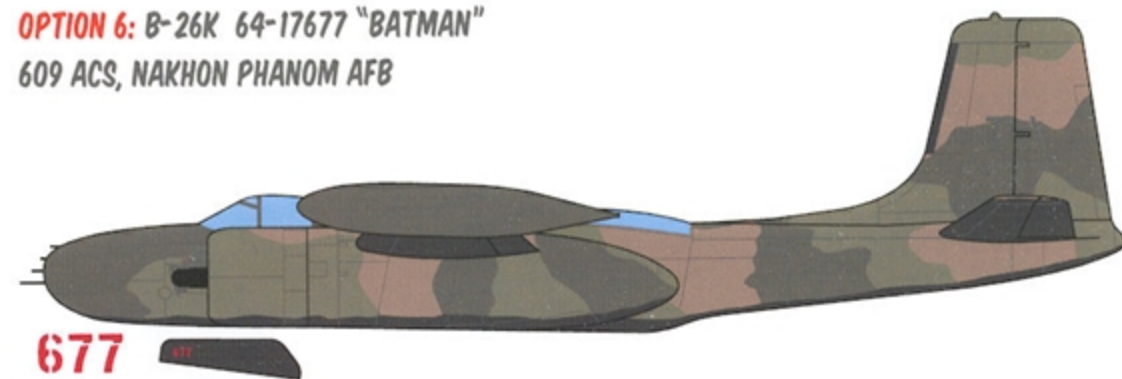

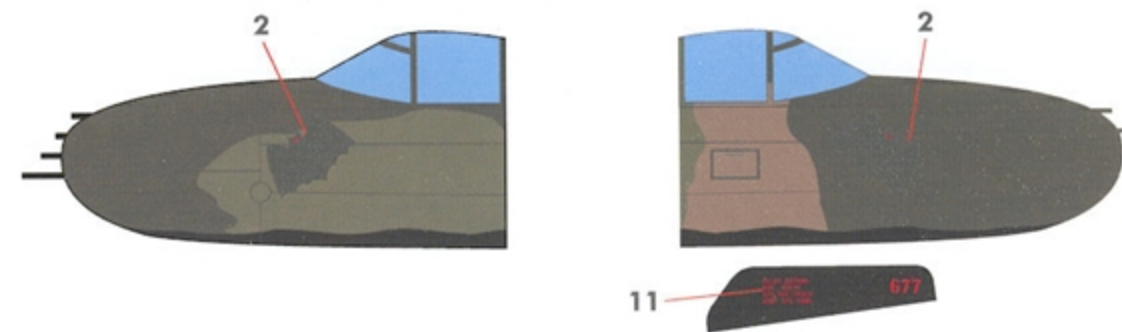

THE STRIPES MARK THIS AS THE COMMANDER'S AIRPLANE. NOTE UNIT BADGE ON TAIL.

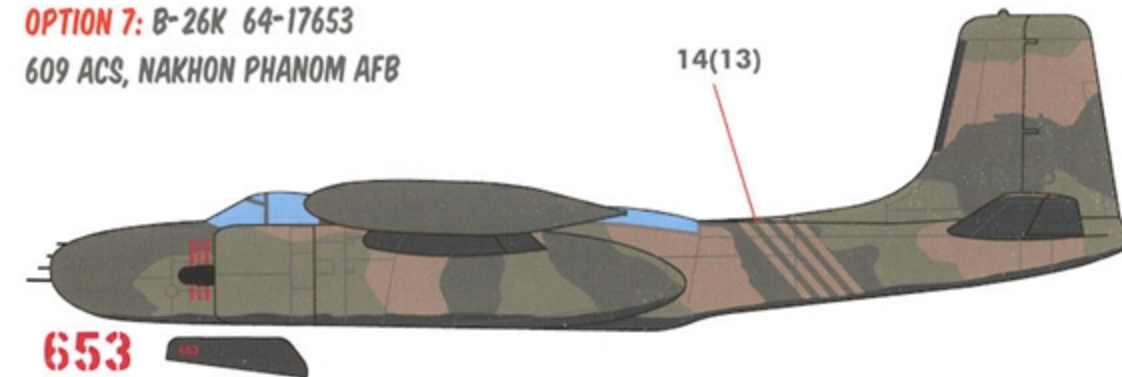

THE "BATMAN" NOSE ART WAS ON BOTH SIDES. NOTE LACK OF PROPELLER WARNING STRIPES.

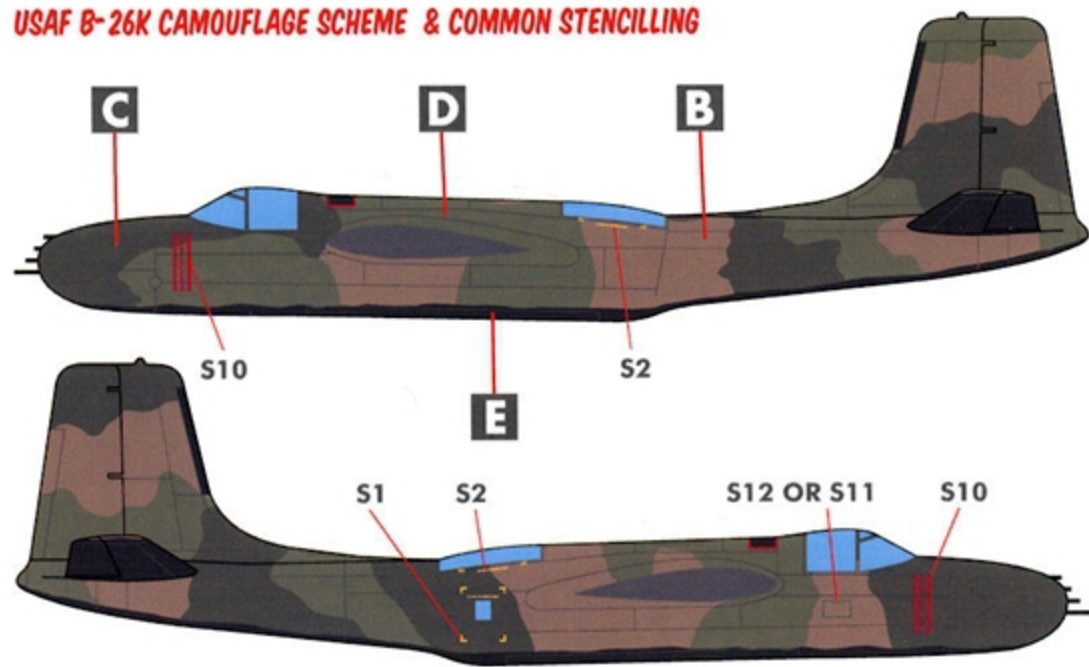

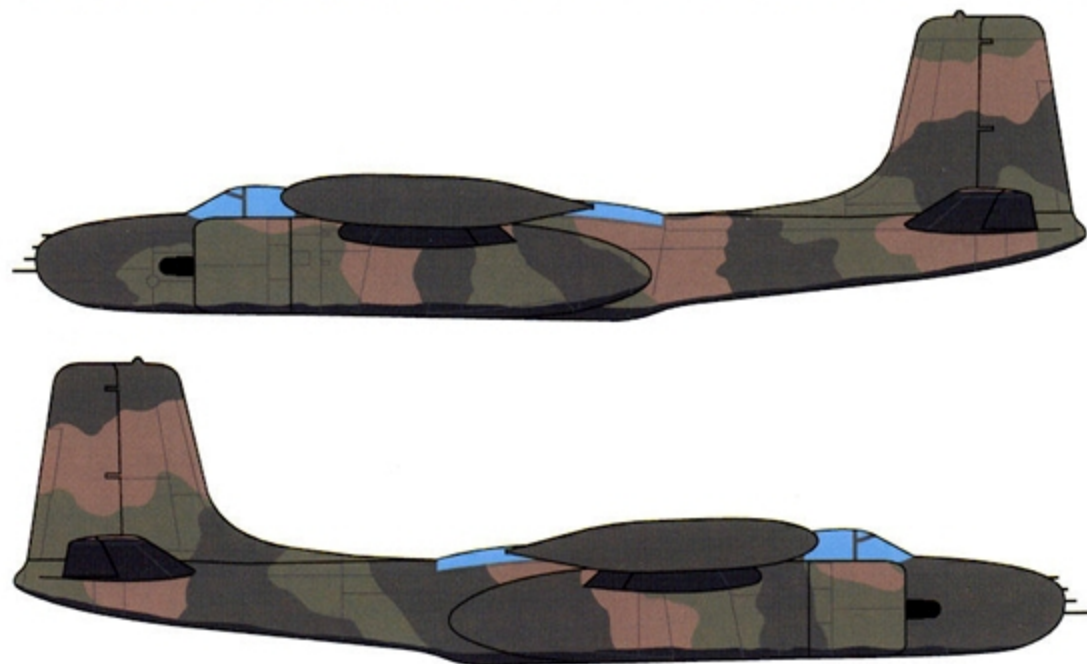

USAF B-26K CAMOUFLAGE SCHEME & COMMON STENCILLING

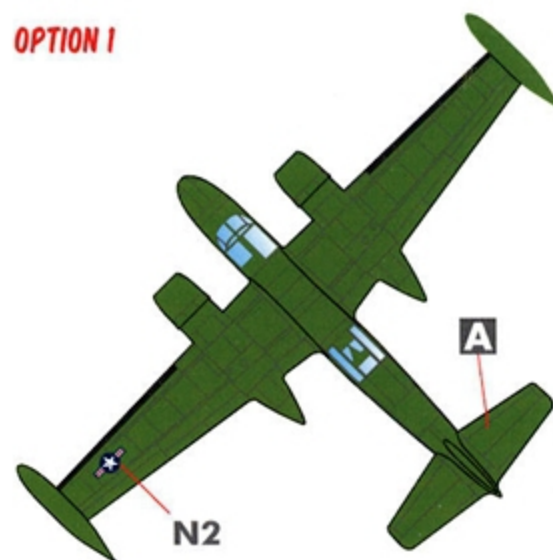

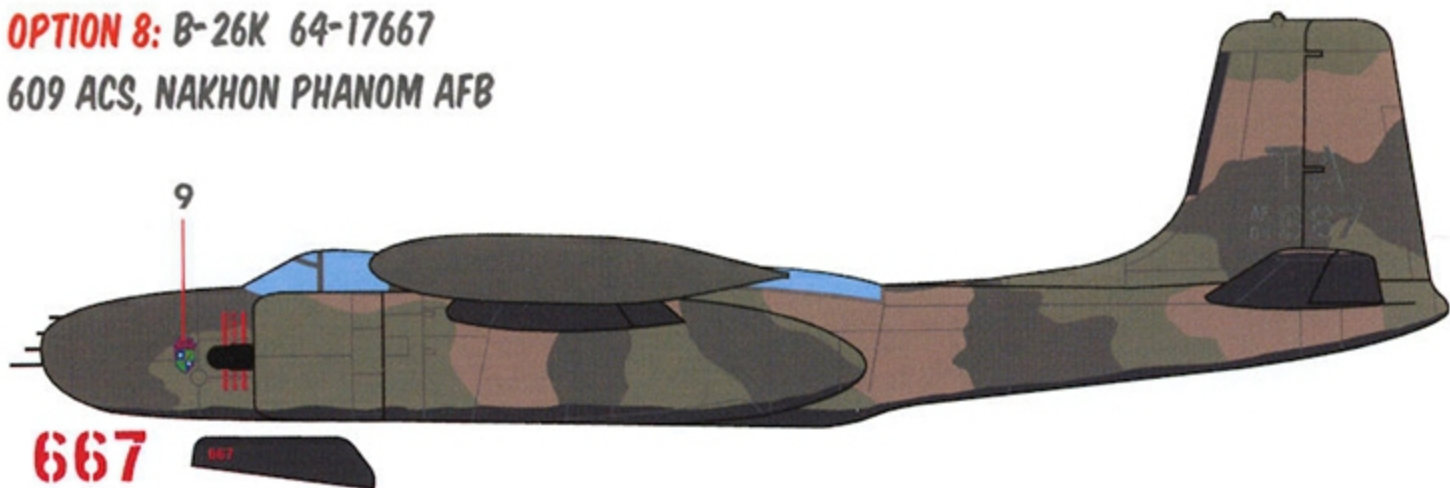

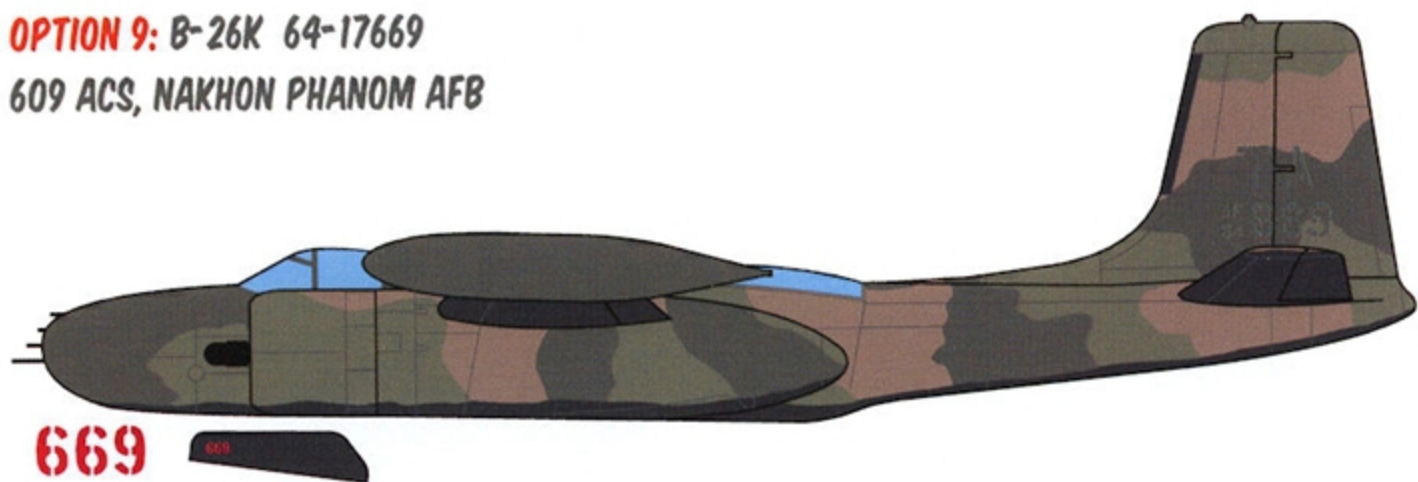

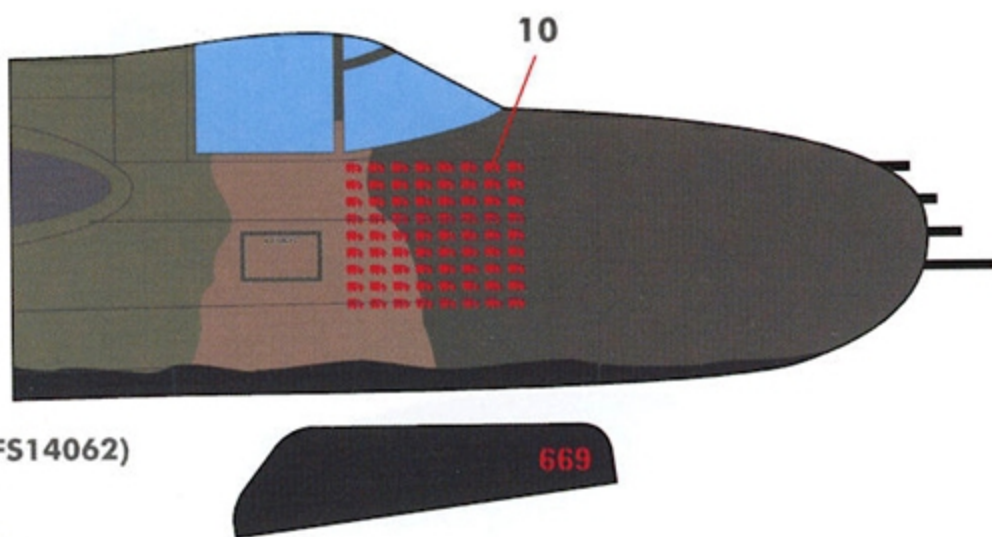

667 WAS SHOT DOWN ON MARCH 23, 1969. PILOT LT. COL. JAMES WESLEY WIDDIS JR. AND NAVIGATOR MAJ. ROBERT CHARLES DAVIS WERE KILLED IN ACTION.
