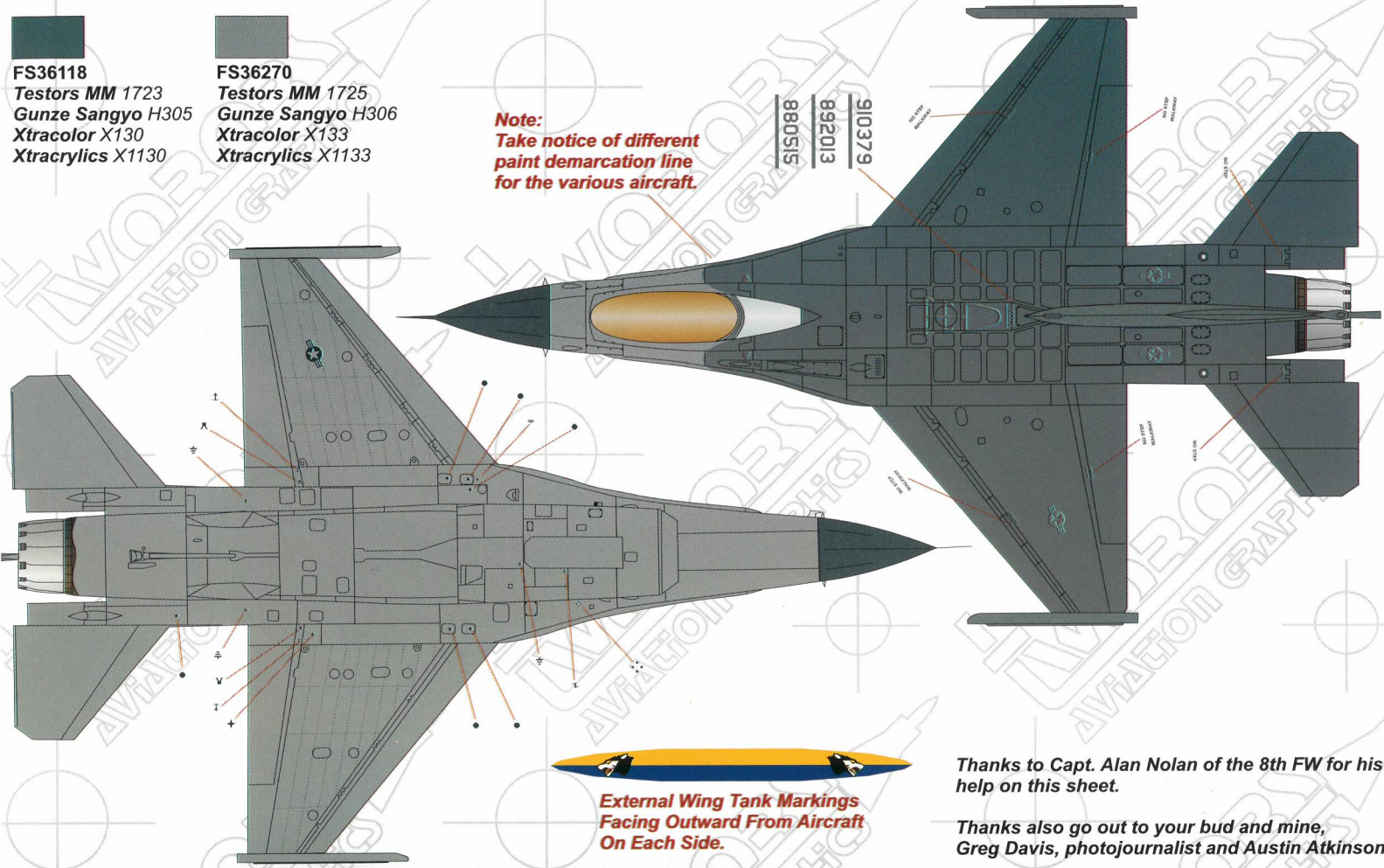

Kunsan's Wolfpack

The 8th FW consists of the 35th Fighter Squadron and the 80th Fighter Squadron. Until the war on terrorism commenced after 9/11, the Wolfpack was known throughout the USAF as the most forward-deployed unit in the USAF.

Constantly on guard and ready to strike, the 8th FW maintains a very heightened state of readiness. Since Kunsan is only 15-minutes (150 miles) away from the DMZ, the aircraft are always armed and ready to defend South Korea. If you ever have the opportunity to visit Kunsan, you'll always know which way "north" is. Just look at which direction the Patriot missile batteries are pointing and that will tell you.

Both squadrons fly the Block 40 version of the F-16. This version is optimized for ground attack in addition to its air-to-air capability and excels especially at night.
