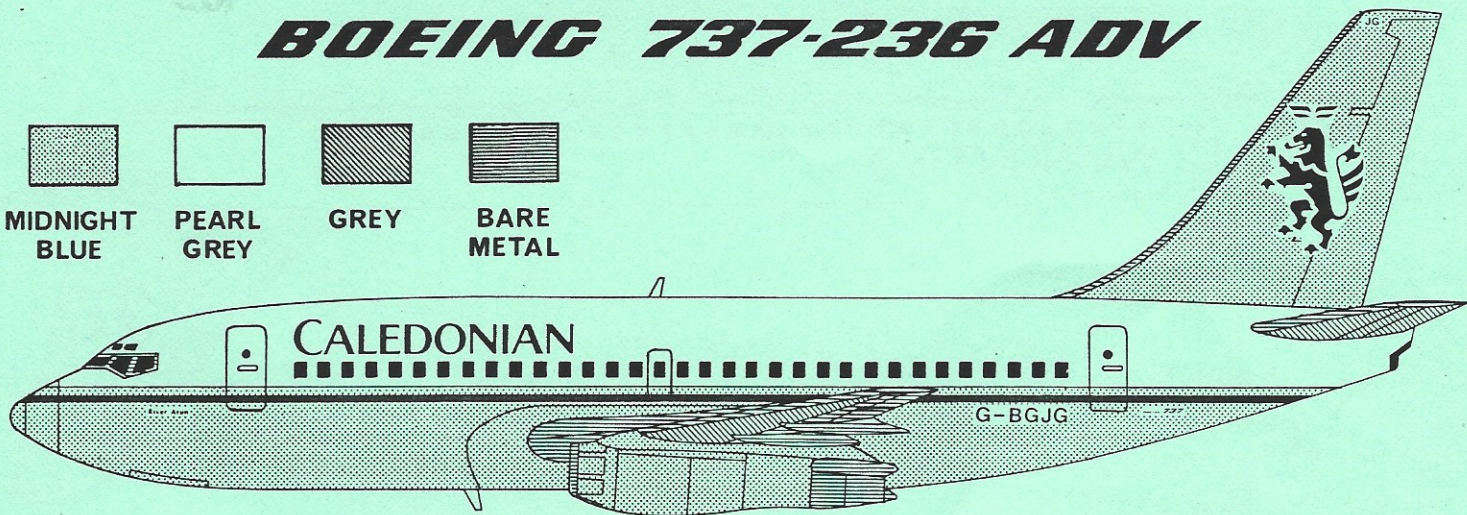
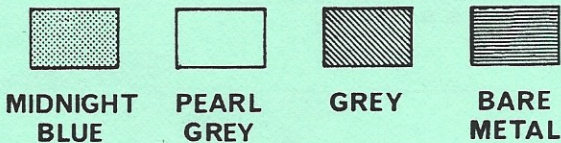

BOEING 737-236 ADV

This decal is designed to produce a 1/144 scale model of a Caledonian Airways Boeing 737-200 in the colours adopted after the merger with British Airways. I recommend the 1/144 scale Airfix or MPC kits.

The Aircraft

All the Boeing 737-236 ADV's in the current fleet were purchased new from the manufacturer (initially for British Airways use). When British Airways was folded into Caledonian Airways following the merger, the aircraft were repainted, and adopted names as follows:

G-BGJF	River Axe
G-BGJG	River Arun
G-BGJH	River Wey

Important Note

All 'Caledonian Yellow' decal components are provided with a corresponding white copy. I recommend that the white decal be applied first, then the yellow piece over the top. This will minimize the tendency of the blue paint to bleed through the yellow decal, and alter the colour.

Assembly Instructions

Assemble the model according to the instructions provided with the kit.

Painting the Model

Samples of the 'British Airways' / 'Caledonian' 'Pearl Grey' and 'Midnight Blue' are provided on the decal sheet. The upper fuselage is Pearl Grey, the lower fuselage, fin and engine nacelles are Midnight Blue. The leading edge of the fin and engine inlet rings are bare metal, and the thrust reversers and APU exhaust are burnt metal. The cockpit and cabin windows have bare metal frames.

Applying the Decals

The fuselage stripes should be applied first. Again, I recommend the use of the white decal under the yellow to reduce the degree to which the blue paint will show through the yellow stripes and lion logo. Each side is supplied in one piece, and should be slightly longer than actually required. I suggest the decal be cut and overlapped somewhere above the wing. Note that the stripes run above the bottom of the cabin doors, run horizontally around the rear fuselage, and dip slightly around the nose. The aircraft names are carried in white on the bottom edge of the cabin doors. The 'last two' of the registration are carried in white on the nose gear doors and at the top of the fin, and in blue above the center of the cockpit window. Some aircraft carry the 'Boeing 737' logo behind the rear cabin door, again level with the bottom edge of the door.
