ANBO-III was the third aircraft of the Lithuanian aircraft designer Antanas Gustaitis.

ANBO-III - was a parasol type two-seater monoplane of mixed construction, designed for the advanced training of pilots, tested in August, 1929. In 1930-1931 two series (four airplanes each) were built and were actively operated until the Soviet occupation in 1940. At the beginning, ANBO-III was also used for reconnaissance purposes.

ANBO-III was the first serially built airplane of Lithuanian construction.


