Hiko Kyodo-tai

The Hiko Kyodo-tai is the only F-15 Aggressor squadron in the world. They are stationed at Nyutabaru AB on the southern part of the island of Kyushu in northern Japan.

A DJ Eagle can be easily built by making these simple modifications.

Leave off the CFTs, get rid of the two ALQ-135 antennas on the tail.

Also, Japanese Eagles do not have the AN/ALQ-128 TEWS antennas on the tips of the vertical stabs. Both wing tip probes are the same size and are only there for weight balance.

Typical load-out is two dummy sidewinders with live seeker heads on the outer wing pylons. ACMI pods are not carried since the JASDF doesn't have access to instrumented ranges like those available here in the US.

Recommended Kits:
Any of the Hasegawa or Academy Strike Eagle kits can be used. These kits more accurately represent a D model Eagle than an E model Strike Eagle.
