



## Post D-Day Spittires 1844/45

Spitfire Mk IX of 340 sqd. (French), Cornwall, April 1944. Standard RAF camouflage of Ocean Gray, Dark Green and Medium Sea Gray. Black spinner, no fuselage band.

Right side reads: Unknown.


Notice fuselage roundels on A/C 2, 3 and 4 are in nonstandard positions.

Spitfire Mk VII, flown by F.L. Jack Cleland after June 12, 1944. Same camouflage colors as A/C1 except for the addition of the Sky Band and spinner. Both sides reads: YQ @ W.

Spitfire Mk IX, of 485 sqd. Flown by P.O. Max Collett, December Camouflaged as per A/C 2. This C wing A/C had the 20mm guns moved to the outer bays and a 50 caliber M.G. installed inboard.


