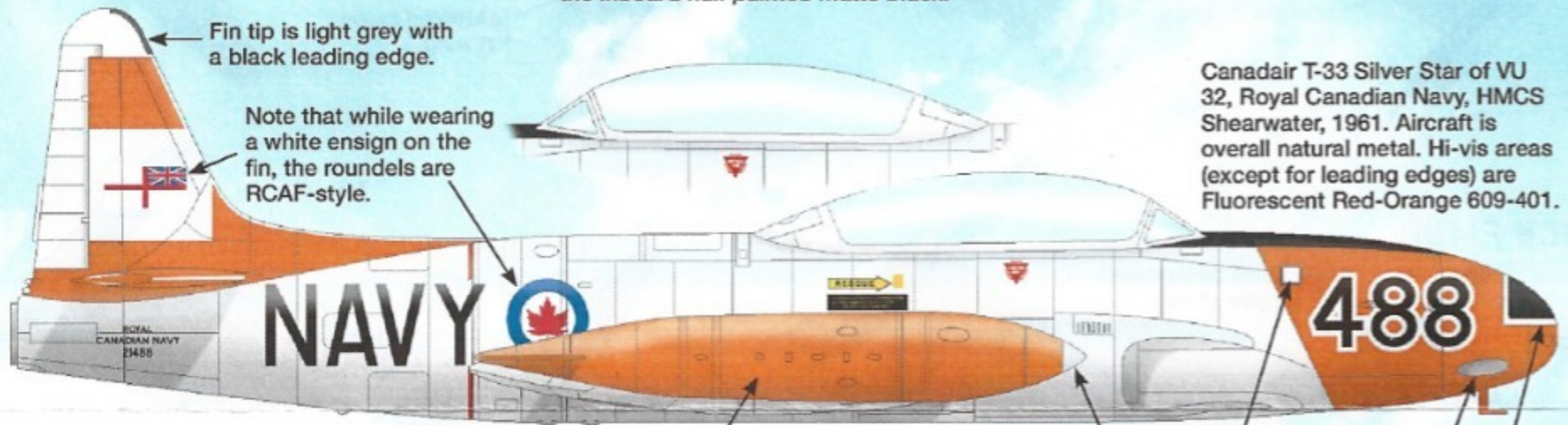

Nose is unpainted.

Intake lip and tip of tank are unpainted.

All radomes are dark grey. All tip tanks have the inboard half painted matte black.



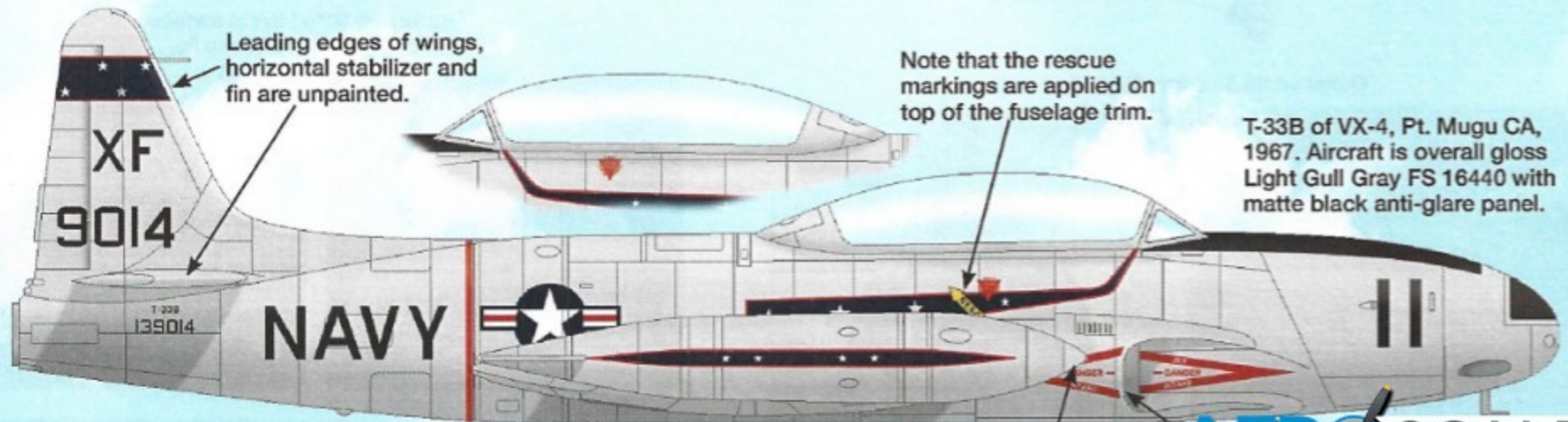
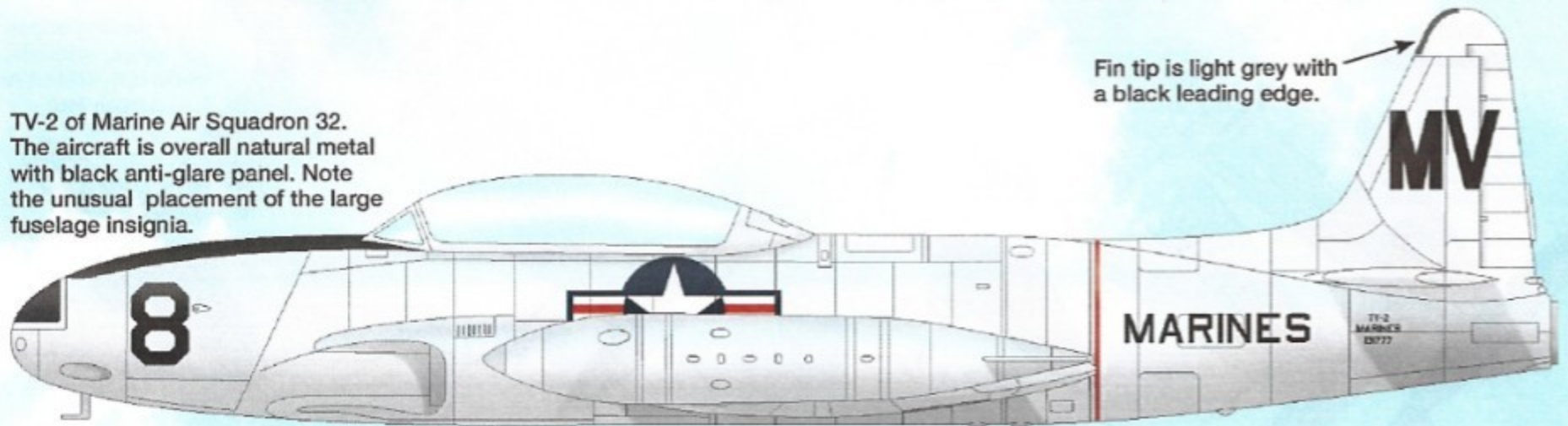
Canadair T-33 Silver Star of VU 32, Royal Canadian Navy, HMCS Shearwater, 1961. Aircraft is overall natural metal. Hi-vis areas (except for leading edges) are Fluorescent Red-Orange 609-401.

Fluorescent Red-Orange 609-401 is similar to US FS 28913.

Tank tip and outlet vents are unpainted.

Gun port and border of radome are unpainted.

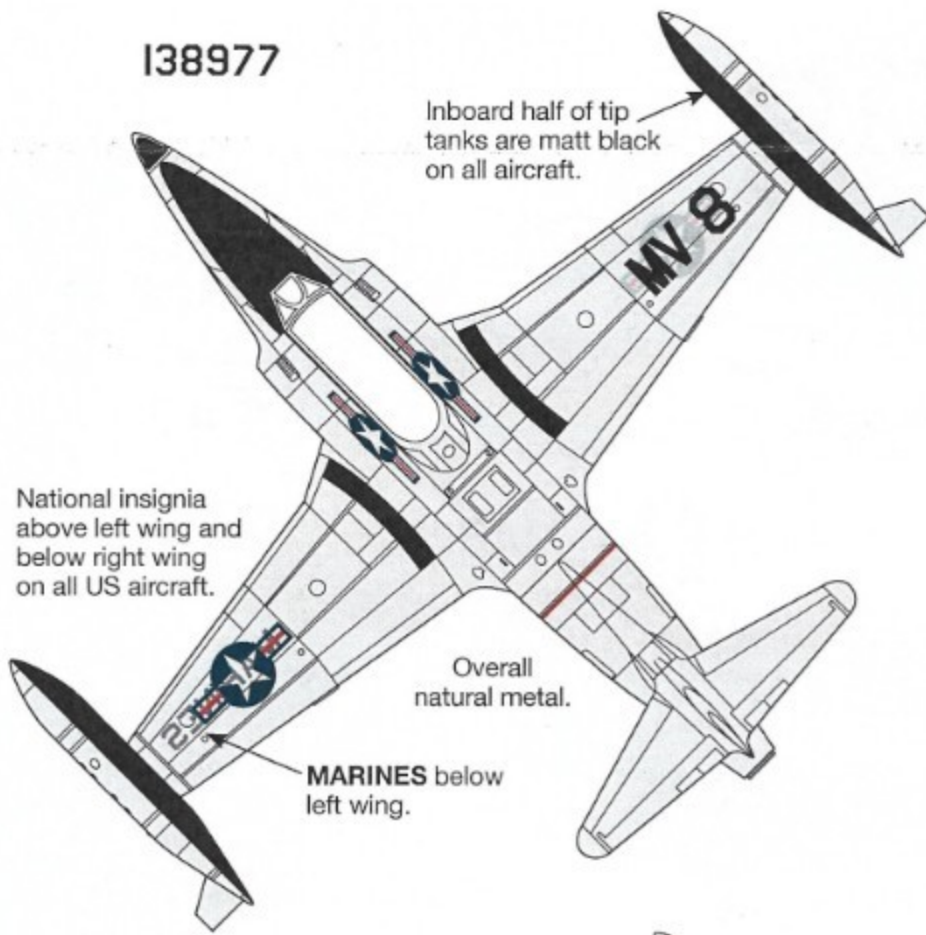
TV-2 of Marine Air Squadron 32. The aircraft is overall natural metal with black anti-glare panel. Note the unusual placement of the large fuselage insignia.



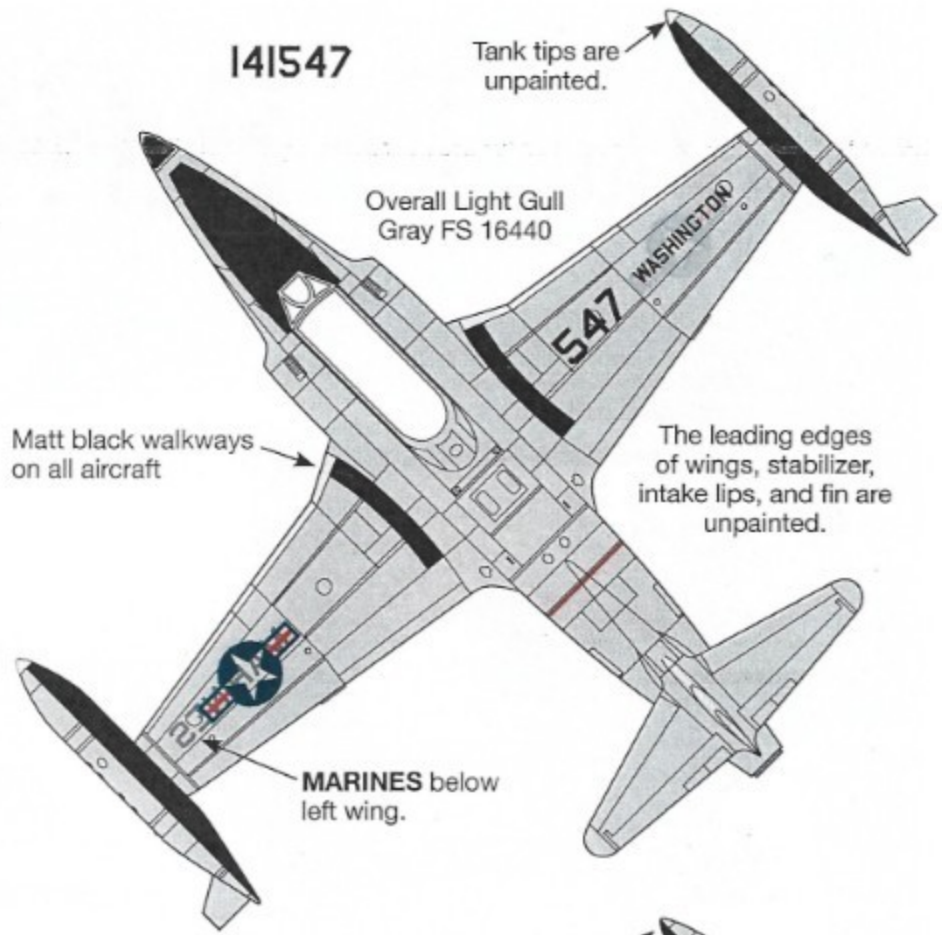

On this aircraft the tank tip is painted.

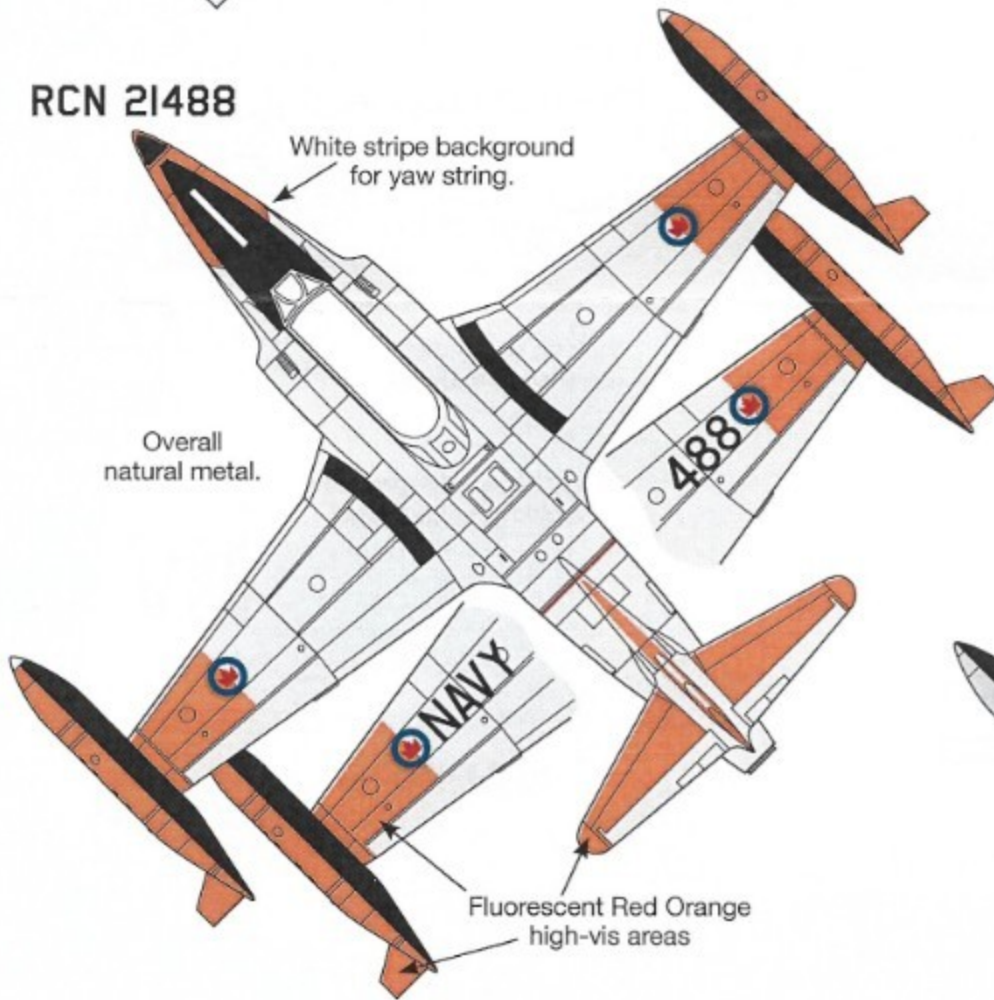

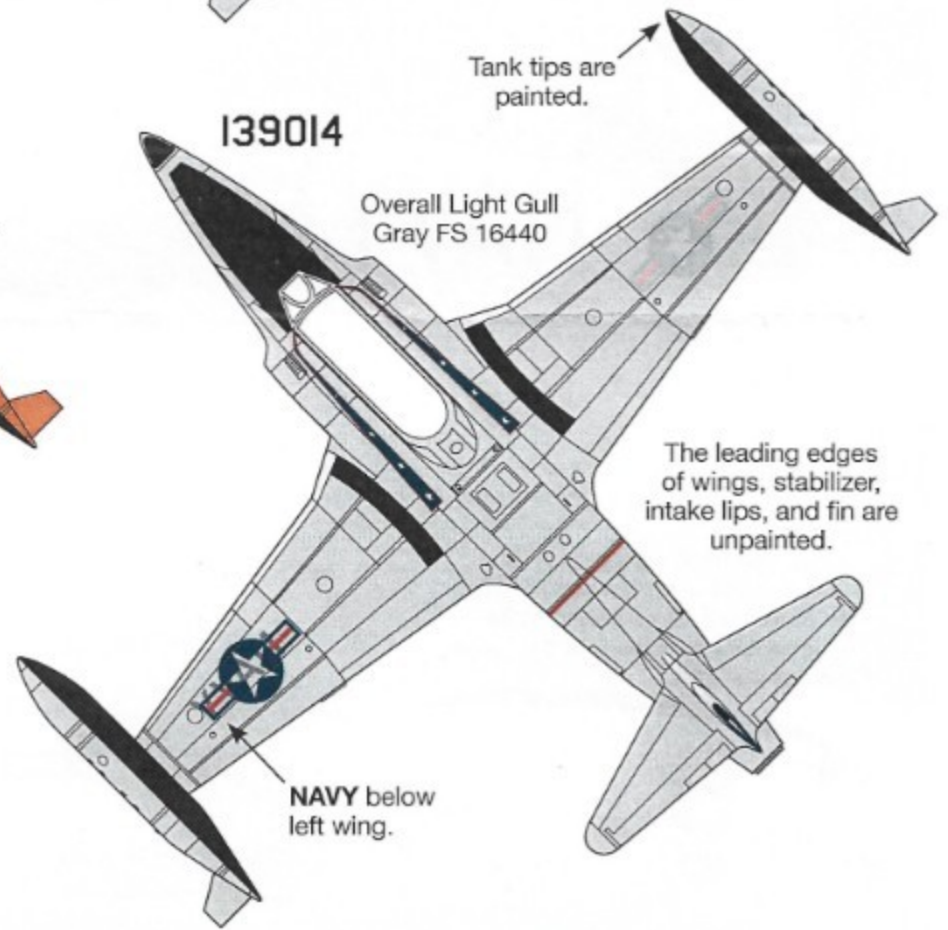

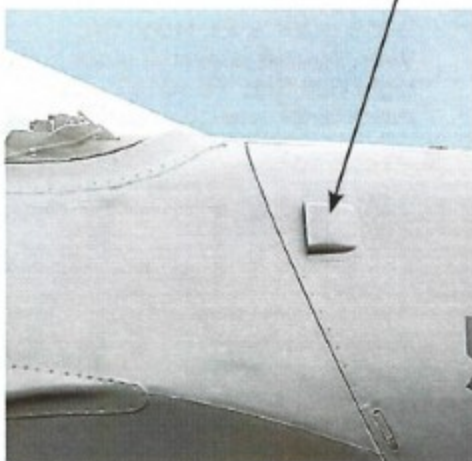
