Graf & Grislawski Part 4

USSR Pilot: Obfw. Alfred Grislawski. This aircraft was flown from 17 July to 21 Sept 1942 at Gonstakovka, USSR, He would claim 8 confirmed victories in this aircraft. Staffel emblem under cockpit with fiancé's name "Ilse" in white.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green mottled on fuselage. Lower cowling, spinner and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Spinner backplate: RLM 70 Black-Green and

White, Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green. National Markings: Fuselage: B5 style 900mm White outline crosses.

Upper Wings: Upper: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses. Lower Wings: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses.

Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline. Stenciling: Factory standard.

Bf 109 G-4 W.Nr. 19451 9/JG 52 May 1943 "White 9" USSR Pilot: Lt. Alfred Grislawski. Flown from Taman in the USSR, 28 May 1943. He would fly this aircraft from 29 April to

23 June 1943 claiming 9 confirmed victories. White 9 applied over fuselage Stammkennzeichen. Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green mottled on fuse-

lage. Lower cowling and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow. Spinner and backplate: RLM 70 Black-Green and White. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B5 style 900mm White outline crosses. Upper Wings: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses. Lower Wings: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses.

Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Factory standard. Stammkennzeichen still visible under wings.

"Chevron Bar" Bf 109 G-6 W.Nr. Unknown Stab./JG 52 Sept. 1944 Pilot: Obstlt.Hermann Graf (provisional). Erla-Haube canopy fitted. Flown from Krakow, Poland late Sept 1944. The

aircraft was likely handed over by the earlier Kommodore, Dietrich Hrabak, upon his return to Germany. Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: RLM 74 Gray-Violet/RLM 75 Gray-Green heavily mottled

on fuselage. Lower cowling and Gruppe band; RLM 04 Yellow, Spinner: Black with White spiral. Spinner back plate: RLM 70 Black-Green and White. Prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses.

Upper Wings: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses.

Lower Wings: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses.

Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline. Stenciling: Factory standard.

"Chevron Bar" Bf 109 G-6 W.Nr. 15729 Stab./JG 11 March 1944

Pilot: Obstlt. Hermann Graf. Erla-Haube canopy fitted. This aircraft was flown from Rotenburg, Germany in March 1944. Note fuselage markings lightly oversprayed in a high altitude scheme of RLM 76; the underlying scheme is 74/75/76, provisional. Originally a G-5 but converted to a G-6.

Colors: Undersurfaces RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces: Extensively oversprayed in high altitude scheme using RLM 76 Light Blue. Lower cowling and Gruppe band: RLM 04 Yellow.

Spinner and prop blades: RLM 70 Black-Green.

National Markings: Fuselage: B5 style 900mm White crosses with very light overspray. Upper Wings: B6 style 1000mm White outline crosses.

Lower Wings: B3 style 900mm Black/White crosses. Hakenkreuz: H2a 300mm Black with White outline.

Stenciling: Likely oversprayed by RLM 76 Light Blue.
