Italian & Egyptian Macchi C.205 Veltro

NOTE: All Veltros on this sheet have vellow-tipped propellers. English color names are used for the sake of convenience. Proper Italian color names are listed at the bottom of the page.

Red 2: Macchi C.205 (Series III) of 3° Squadriglia, l' Gruppo Caccia, ANR (National Republican Aviation), March 1944. This aircraft wears an Italian version of the mid-war Luftwaffe RLM 74/75/76 camouflage. The upper fuselage is RLM 75. The sides and undersurfaces are RLM 76 with the sides being mottled with RLM 75. Note that the RLM 75/76 extends onto the spinner, of which 1/3 remains white. Wing upper surfaces, which carry white fasces, are RLM 74/75 in an undetermined pattern.

Red 4: ANR Macchi C.205 (Series III), 2° Squadriglia, I° Gruppo Caccia, January 1944. Uppersurfaces are Dark Olive Green "ringlets" over a Light Hazel Brown base. Note that the ringlets are actually comprised of stylized "W" shapes of an earlier mottle pattern developed for Macchi C.202s operating in North Africa. The lower surfaces are Light Azure Gray. The white spinner features a black spiral with a camouflaged backplate.

Red 4: Italian Regia Aeronautica Macchi C.205 (Series I), 70° Squadriglia, XXIII Gruppo, 3° Stormo, Rome, summer of 1943. Upper surfaces are Dark Olive Green mottling over Light Hazel Brown. Lower surfaces are Light Azure Gray. White spinner and regulation Mediterranean theatre white fuselage band. Note that this Veltro's upper camouflage does not wrap around the nose and fuselage. However, it does cover the spinner backplate.

Black 1214: Royal Egyptian Air Force (REAF) Macchi C.205, 2nd Squadron, December 1948. Note that this aircraft is a rebuilt C.202, retaining the fixed tail wheel. The fuselage dorsal spine antenna lead-in has been removed. It is thought this aircraft originally was overall Dark Olive Green upon its delivery to Egypt and that when the Egyptians took possession they added RAF Middlestone to the uppersurface and

fuselage bands were also applied. Before the overthrow of Egypt's monarchy,

the crescent within the national insignia usually appeared to the left — with all stars pointing outward.

The right side fuselage roundel on REAF Veltros had the crescent


to the rear. After Nasser's 1952 coup, the national insignia was changed slightly: the three stars were turned to point upward and

the crescents were variously positioned. Extra roundel centers (decals 45) depict this subtle change.

White K: REAF Macchi C.205 (Series III), #1213, 2nd Squadron, January 1949, in RAF Middlestone and Dark Earth over Azure Blue with a white spinner. Note the removed fuselage dorsal spine antenna lead-in and the subtle differences in the two "Ks". There is a photo of this Veltro at an earlier time when it was painted with two colors: Dark Earth and Azure Blue. If you like, omit the Middlestone. Orientation of national insignia is the same as that of "Black 1214".

NOTE: Stenciling applies to Italian Veltros only.
