









Overall Aircraft FS 36270

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Aircraft Notes

All aircraft of the 421st Fighter Squadron are block 40 F-16s Here are some block 40 characteristics:

- Heavy weight gear, larger tires, bulged main gear doors
- Landing lights relocated to nose gear door
- Use of targeting & navigation pods
- 2 additional AN/ALE-47 chaff/flare units
- GE engine with MCID "Big Mouth" intake
- Wide Angle Raster (WAR) HUD
- 10 external strengthening plates on upper fuselage

Modeling Notes

The Hasegawa F-16CG block 40 kits contain most all of the above mentioned parts. The more common F-16CJ block 50 kit can also be used, but it won't have the LANTIRN. Here is a list of recommended aftermarket items:

<u>BlackBox</u> CS48004 F-16 Cockpit set. www.vmdstudios.com This set contains the WAR HUD, and just looks sweet!

<u>Eduard</u> set #49204. www.eduard.com Yeah, it says block 50, but the set contains the 10 stiffener plates, and the additional chaff/flare buckets.

www.shull24.com A cool guy who makes resin sets for modern jets! Most sets are for the F-16, many of which can be used with this sheet including: -184 ECM pod, JDAMS, Towed Decoys. Look for future releases that will complement these decals!

Deployment Notes

All aircraft have their pilot, crew chief, and maintaners names removed when deployed overseas.

1st OIF Deployment, Al Udied, Qatar

For the first stages of Op. Iraqi Freedom, full weapons loads were carried. LAU-129 missile rails were on the wingtip stations, and LAU-129 and/or sidewinder/towed decoy pylons underwing.

F-16 #88-0421, the 421st squadron commanders's jet, was heavily damaged when it lost hydraulic power while taxing. It ran into another parked F-16 and the live AIM-9 it was carrying caught fire. #88-0471 replaced it as the squadron commander's jet.


2nd OIF Deployment, Balad AB, Iraq


For their second tour, minimal weapon loads were carried. There was minimal threat from air or ground attack; ECM, towed decoys, and AIM-9s were seldom carried. The 421st also rarely put AIM-120s on the wingtip rails, preferring to load them under the wings.

The ANG unit that the 421st replaced left their AN/AAQ-28 Litening II targeting pods, which the Black Widows used during their deployment.

The 421st also had the distinction of being one of the first USAF units to use the new 500lb GBU-38 JDAM.

F-16 #88-0471, the new squadron commander's jet, oddly carried the 16S210 sidewinder rails on the wingtips.
