Suggested Kit: Hasegawa 1/32 scale Fw 190D-9

Very Dirty appearance on these A/C specially around the exhaust/fuselage area.

A/C of operation Bodden-Platte. Center bomb rack for SC250 Bomb. Focke-Wulf Fw-190D-9 of JG2, January, 1945. RLM 83 Dunkelgrün fuselage and RLM 83/RLM 75 Grauviolet upper wings. RLM 76 Lichtblau beneath, heavy RLM 82 tail mottling and no fuselage mottling. Black spinner. Photo on page 5, reference 4. Fuselage upper surface may have been a segmented style, but our photo is not 100% clear. Wr.Nr. is unknown. A fictitious number is provided and should be used only if you so desire.



Focke-Wulf Fw-190D-9, A/C captured by British Forces and turned over to USAAC, Spring 1945. Segmented scheme of RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolet over RLM 76 Lichtblau with heavy RLM 82 tail mottling and no fuselage mottling. Black spinner with short spiral. Reference 6 page 57.



Focke-Wulf Fw-190D-9, of IV/JG3, Frenzlaa, Germany, 1945. Segmented camouflage scheme of RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolet over RLM 76 Lichtblau with RLM 83 Dunkelgrün and RLM 75 Grauviolet tail mottling. Home defense bands overpainted in RLM 75. Wing root cannot cover panels are painted RLM76. Reference one, page 71 and front cover. Wr.Nr. is unknown. A fictitious number is provided and should be used only if you so desire.

Two full sets of stencils for the Fw-190 A/F/D are provided. Looking at pictures of these late war A/C, they do not seem to have all stencils applied. We are supplying you two sets in the hope that you find them useful perhaps when completing a future BMW powered bird.
